	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
1	AN ACT
2	relating to requiring a voter to present proof of identification.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Section 63.001, Election Code, is amended by
5	amending Subsections (b), (c), (d), and (f) and adding Subsections
6	(g) and (h) to read as follows:
7	(b) On offering to vote, a voter must present to an election
8	officer at the polling place the voter's voter registration
9	certificate and either:
10	(1) one form of identification listed in Section
11	<u>63.0101(a); or</u>
12	(2) two different forms of identification listed in
13	<pre>Section 63.0101(b) [to an election officer at the polling place].</pre>
14	(c) On presentation of <u>the documentation required by</u>
15	Subsection (b) [a registration certificate], an election officer
16	shall determine whether the voter's name on the registration
17	certificate is on the list of registered voters for the precinct.
18	(d) If the voter's name is on the precinct list of
19	registered voters and the voter's identity can be verified from the
20	documentation presented under Subsection (b), the voter shall be
21	accepted for voting.
22	(f) After determining whether to accept a voter, an election
23	officer shall return the voter's <u>documentation</u> [registration
24	certificate] to the voter.

1	(g) If the requirements for identification prescribed by
2	Subsection (b) are not met, the voter may be accepted for
3	provisional voting only under Section 63.011.
4	(h) The requirements for identification prescribed by
5	Subsection (b)(1) or (2) do not apply to a voter who:
6	(1) presents the voter's voter registration
7	certificate on offering to vote; and
8	(2) is 65 years of age or older as indicated by the
9	date of birth on the voter's voter registration certificate.
10	SECTION 2. Section 63.006(a), Election Code, is amended to
11	read as follows:
12	(a) A voter who, when offering to vote, presents a voter
13	registration certificate indicating that the voter is currently
14	registered in the precinct in which the voter is offering to vote,
15	but whose name is not on the precinct list of registered voters,
16	shall be accepted for voting if the voter's identity can be verified
17	from the documentation presented under Section 63.001(b).
18	SECTION 3. Section 63.007(a), Election Code, is amended to
19	read as follows:
20	(a) A voter who, when offering to vote, presents a voter
21	registration certificate indicating that the voter is currently
22	registered in a different precinct from the one in which the voter
23	is offering to vote, and whose name is not on the precinct list of
24	registered voters, shall be accepted for voting if the voter's
25	identity can be verified from the documentation presented under
26	Section 63.001(b) and the voter executes an affidavit stating that
27	the voter:

(1) is a resident of the precinct in which the voter is
 offering to vote or is otherwise entitled by law to vote in that
 precinct;

4 (2) was a resident of the precinct in which the voter 5 is offering to vote at the time that information on the voter's 6 residence address was last provided to the voter registrar;

7 (3) did not deliberately provide false information to
8 secure registration in a precinct in which the voter does not
9 reside; and

10

(4) is voting only once in the election.

SECTION 4. Section 63.008(a), Election Code, is amended to read as follows:

A voter who does not present a voter registration 13 (a) 14 certificate when offering to vote, but whose name is on the list of 15 registered voters for the precinct in which the voter is offering to vote, shall be accepted for voting if the voter executes an 16 17 affidavit stating that the voter does not have the voter's voter registration certificate in the voter's possession at the polling 18 19 place at the time of offering to vote and the voter's identity can be verified from the identification presented under Section 20 63.001(b)(1) or (2) [voter presents proof of identification in a 21 form described by Section 63.0101]. 22

23 SECTION 5. Section 63.0101, Election Code, is amended to 24 read as follows:

25 Sec. 63.0101. DOCUMENTATION OF PROOF OF IDENTIFICATION. 26 (a) The following documentation is <u>an</u> acceptable <u>form</u> [<del>as proof</del>] of 27 <u>photo</u> identification under this chapter:

1 (1)a driver's license or personal identification card issued to the person by the Department of Public Safety that has not 2 3 expired or that expired no earlier than two years before the date of presentation [or a similar document issued to the person by an 4 5 agency of another state, regardless of whether the license or card has expired]; 6 7 (2) a United States military identification card that contains the person's photograph 8 [form of identification containing the person's photograph that establishes the person's 9 10 identity]; a valid employee identification card that contains 11 (3) 12 the person's photograph and is issued by an employer of the person in the ordinary course of the employer's business 13 [birth 14 certificate or other document confirming birth that is admissible 15 in a court of law and establishes the person's identity]; 16 (4) a United States citizenship certificate [papers] 17 issued to the person that contains the person's photograph; a United States passport issued to the person; 18 (5) 19 (6) a student identification card issued by a public or private institution of higher education located in Texas that 20 contains the person's photograph [official mail addressed to the 21 person by name from a governmental entity]; or 22 23 a license to carry a concealed handgun issued to (7) 24 the person by the Department of Public Safety. (b) The following documentation is acceptable as proof of 25 26 identification under this chapter: 27 (1) a copy of a current utility bill, bank statement,

No. 1414 1 government check, paycheck, or other government document that shows the name and address of the voter; 2 3 (2) official mail addressed to the person by name from a governmental entity; 4 5 (3) a certified copy of a birth certificate or other document confirming birth that is admissible in a court of law and 6 7 establishes the person's identity; 8 (4) United States citizenship papers issued to the 9 person; 10 (5) an original or certified copy of the person's marriage license or divorce decree; 11 12 (6) court records of the person's adoption, name 13 change, or sex change; 14 (7) an identification card issued to the person by a 15 governmental entity of this state or the United States for the purpose of obtaining public benefits, including veteran's 16 17 benefits, Medicaid, or Medicare; 18 (8) a temporary driving permit issued to the person by 19 the Department of Public Safety; (9) a pilot's license issued to the person by the 20 Federal Aviation Administration or another authorized agency of the 21 22 United States; (10) a library card that contains the person's name 23 24 issued to the person by a public library located in this state; or 25 (11) a hunting or fishing license issued to a person by 26 the Parks and Wildlife Department [or [(8) any other form of identification prescribed 27

2 SECTION 6. Sections 63.011(a) and (b), Election Code, are 3 amended to read as follows:

4 (a) A person to whom Section <u>63.001(g)</u>, 63.008(b), or
5 63.009(a) applies may cast a provisional ballot if the person
6 executes an affidavit stating that the person:

person seeks to vote; and

is a registered voter in the precinct in which the

(2) is eligible to vote in the election.

10 (b) A form for an affidavit required by this section must [shall] be printed on an envelope in which the provisional ballot 11 12 voted by the person may be placed and must include a space for entering the identification number of the provisional ballot voted 13 14 by the person and a space for an election officer to indicate 15 whether the person presented proof of identification as required by Section 63.001(b)(1) or (2). The affidavit form may include space 16 17 for disclosure of any necessary information to enable the person to register to vote under Chapter 13. The secretary of state shall 18 prescribe the form of the affidavit under this section. 19

20 SECTION 7. Section 65.054(b), Election Code, is amended to 21 read as follows:

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(b) A provisional ballot may be accepted only if:

23 <u>(1)</u> the board determines that, from the information in 24 the affidavit or contained in public records, the person is 25 eligible to vote in the election and has not previously voted in 26 that election<u>; and</u>

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(2) the voter presents proof of identification as

1	required by Section 63.001(b)(1) or (2):
2	(A) at the time the ballot was cast; or
3	(B) in the period prescribed under Section
4	65.0541.
5	SECTION 8. Subchapter B, Chapter 65, Election Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 65.0541 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 65.0541. PRESENTATION OF IDENTIFICATION FOR CERTAIN
8	PROVISIONAL BALLOTS. (a) A voter who is accepted for provisional
9	voting under Section 63.011 because the voter does not present
10	proof of identification as required by Section 63.001(b)(1) or (2)
11	may, not later than the 10th business day after the date of the
12	election, present proof of identification to the voter registrar
13	for examination by the early voting ballot board.
14	(b) The secretary of state shall prescribe procedures as
15	necessary to implement this section.
16	SECTION 9. Section 521.422, Transportation Code, is amended
17	by amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (d) to read as
18	follows:
19	(a) <u>Except as provided by Subsection (d)</u> , the [ <del>The</del> ] fee for
20	a personal identification certificate is:
21	(1) \$15 for a person under 60 years of age;
22	(2) \$5 for a person 60 years of age or older; and
23	(3) \$20 for a person subject to the registration
24	requirements under Chapter 62, Code of Criminal Procedure.
25	(d) The department may not collect a fee for a personal
26	identification certificate issued to a person who executes an
27	affidavit stating that the person is financially unable to pay the

1	required fee and:
2	(1) who is a registered voter in this state and
3	presents a valid voter registration certificate; or
4	(2) who is eligible for registration under Section
5	13.001, Election Code, and submits a registration application to
6	the department.
7	SECTION 10. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
