5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. The legislature recognizes that undocumented
7	immigrants bring in approximately \$424.7 million more in annual
8	revenue to the state than the state spends on services provided to
9	them, and yet many do not have health insurance and are ineligible
10	for public assistance for medical expenses. It is the intent of the
11	legislature to allocate this revenue to help cover the expenses of
12	medical care for indigent persons, some of whom are undocumented
13	immigrants.
14	SECTION 2. Chapter 61, Health and Safety Code, is amended by
15	adding Subchapter D to read as follows:
16	SUBCHAPTER D. INDIGENT EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES AND PREVENTATIVE
17	HEALTH CARE REIMBURSEMENT FUND
