9	prepaid funeral benefits contract may not be considered in default
10	under the contract if:
11	(1) the purchaser has paid at least 85 percent of the
12	contract price; and
13	(2) the purchaser was unable to pay due to extenuating
14	financial circumstances.
15	(b) A funeral provider is not required to provide funeral
16	merchandise or services under a trust-funded prepaid funeral
17	benefits contract unless any remaining balance, including any
18	applicable finance charge, owed under the contract is paid before
19	the funeral service or the funeral provider agrees in writing to
20	another payment arrangement.
21	(c) This section does not affect a purchaser's right to
22	cancel a trust-funded prepaid funeral benefits contract.
23	SECTION 2. Subtitle B, Title 8, Health and Safety Code, is
24	amended by adding Chapter 695 to read as follows:

1	CHAPTER 695. IN-CASKET IDENTIFICATION
2	Sec. 695.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
3	(1) "Casket" means a container used to hold the
4	remains of a deceased person.
5	(2) "Commission" means the Texas Funeral Service
6	Commission.
7	Sec. 695.002. IDENTIFICATION OF DECEASED PERSON. The
8	commission shall ensure a casket contains identification of the
9	deceased person, including the person's name, date of birth, and
10	date of death.
11	Sec. 695.003. RULES. The commission may adopt rules to
12	enforce this chapter.
13	SECTION 3. Section 711.008(b), Health and Safety Code, is
14	amended to read as follows:
15	(b) Subsection (a) does not apply to:
16	(1) a cemetery heretofore established and operating;
17	(2) the establishment and use of a columbarium by an
18	organized religious society or sect that is exempt from income
19	taxation under Section 501(a), Internal Revenue Code of 1986, by
20	being listed under Section 501(c)(3) of that code, as part of or
21	attached to the principal church building owned by the society or
22	sect;
23	(3) the establishment and use of a columbarium:
24	(A) in a municipality with a population of at
25	least 1.8 million; and
26	(B) by an organized religious society or sect,
27	that is exempt from income taxation under Section 501(a), Internal

H.B. No. 1468 Revenue Code of 1986, by being listed under Section 501(c)(3) of 1 that code, on land that: 2 3 (i) is owned by the society or sect; and 4 (ii) is part of the campus on which an 5 existing principal church building is located; [or] (4) the establishment and use of a columbarium on the 6 7 campus of a private or independent institution of higher education, 8 as defined by Section 61.003, Education Code, that is wholly or substantially controlled, managed, owned, or supported by or 9 10 otherwise affiliated with an organized religious society or sect that is exempt from income taxation under Section 501(a), Internal 11 12 Revenue Code of 1986, by being listed under Section 501(c)(3) of that code, if a place of worship is located on the campus; or 13 14 (5) the establishment and use of a mausoleum that is: 15 (A) constructed beneath the principal church building owned by an organized religious society or sect that: 16 17 (i) is exempt from income taxation under Section 501(a), Internal Revenue Code of 1986, by being listed 18 19 under Section 501(c)(3) of that code; and (ii) has recognized religious traditions 20 and practices of interring the remains of ordained clergy in or 21 below the principal church building; and 22 23 (B) used only for the interment of the remains of 24 ordained clergy of that organized religious society or sect. SECTION 4. Section 711.012(b), Health and Safety Code, is 25 26 amended to read as follows: (b) The Texas Funeral Service Commission may adopt rules, 27

establish procedures, and prescribe forms to enforce and administer
 Sections 711.003, 711.008, 711.010, 711.011, 711.021-711.035,
 711.038, <u>711.0395</u>, 711.041, 711.042, <u>711.052</u>, 711.061, and 711.062
 relating to cemeteries that are not perpetual care cemeteries.

5 SECTION 5. Section 711.038, Health and Safety Code, is 6 amended by adding Subsection (f) to read as follows:

7 (f) A cemetery organization may not resell the exclusive 8 right of sepulture in a plot unless the exclusive right of sepulture 9 has been reacquired by the cemetery organization. A sanction or 10 other penalty may not be imposed on a cemetery organization that 11 violates this subsection unless:

12 <u>(1) the state agency authorized to enforce this</u> 13 <u>section provides the cemetery organization written notice of the</u> 14 <u>violation; and</u>

15 (2) the cemetery organization does not correct the 16 violation before the 91st day after the date on which the cemetery 17 organization received the notice.

SECTION 6. Subchapter C, Chapter 711, Health and Safety
Code, is amended by adding Section 711.0395 to read as follows:

20 <u>Sec. 711.0395. MULTIPLE INTERMENTS IN SAME PLOT. A</u> 21 <u>cemetery organization may not make more than one interment in a plot</u> 22 <u>unless each owner of the plot consents to the interment.</u>

23 SECTION 7. Section 711.041, Health and Safety Code, is 24 amended to read as follows:

25 Sec. 711.041. ACCESS TO CEMETERY. (a) Any person who 26 wishes to visit a cemetery or private burial grounds for which no 27 public ingress or egress is available shall have the right to

1 reasonable ingress and egress for the purpose of visiting the 2 cemetery or private burial grounds. This right of access extends 3 only to visitation during <u>the</u> [reasonable] hours <u>determined by the</u> 4 <u>owner or owners of the lands under Subsection (b) or at a reasonable</u> 5 <u>time as provided by Subsection (c)</u> and only for purposes usually 6 associated with cemetery visits.

7 The owner or owners of the lands surrounding the (b) 8 cemetery or private burial grounds may designate the routes of reasonable ingress and egress and reasonable hours of availability. 9 (c) At a time other than the time provided by Subsection 10 (b), the owner or owners of the lands surrounding a cemetery or 11 12 private burial grounds must allow a person to enter and exit the owner's land for the purpose of visiting the cemetery or private 13 14 burial grounds if: 15 (1) the person provides written notice to the owner or owners of the lands surrounding the cemetery or private burial 16 17 grounds of the person's visit; (2) the person provides the notice required by 18 19 Subdivision (1) not later than the 14th day before the date the person wishes to visit the cemetery; and 20 21 (3) the time of the visit is reasonable.

22 SECTION 8. Subchapter D, Chapter 711, Health and Safety 23 Code, is amended by adding Section 711.0515 to read as follows:

24 <u>Sec. 711.0515. INJUNCTIVE RELIEF.</u> In addition to bringing 25 <u>an action under Section 711.051</u>, the attorney general at the 26 <u>request of the Texas Funeral Service Commission may bring an action</u> 27 <u>for injunctive relief to enforce this chapter or a rule or order</u>

1	adopted by the commission under this chapter.
2	SECTION 9. Subchapter D, Chapter 711, Health and Safety
3	Code, is amended by adding Section 711.0521 to read as follows:
4	Sec. 711.0521. ACCESS TO CEMETERIES; CRIMINAL PENALTIES.
5	(a) A person who is an individual, firm, association, corporation,
6	or municipality, or an officer, agent, or employee of an
7	individual, firm, association, corporation, or municipality,
8	commits an offense if the person interferes with a person's
9	reasonable right to ingress and egress under Section 711.041.
10	(b) An offense under this section is a Class C misdemeanor.
11	SECTION 10. Subchapter A, Chapter 716, Health and Safety
12	Code, is amended by adding Section 716.0035 to read as follows:
13	Sec. 716.0035. ACCEPTANCE OF REMAINS. A crematory
14	establishment may accept deceased human remains for refrigeration
15	before it receives authorization to cremate the remains under
16	Subchapter B.
17	SECTION 11. Subchapter B, Chapter 716, Health and Safety
18	Code, is amended by adding Section 716.054 to read as follows:
19	Sec. 716.054. EXCEPTION; WRITTEN DIRECTIONS. (a) This
20	section applies and a cremation authorization form is not required
21	under this chapter if:
22	(1) the deceased person has left written directions
23	for the disposition by cremation of the deceased person's human
24	remains as provided by Section 711.002(g); and
25	(2) the authorizing agent refuses for any reason to
26	sign a cremation authorization form.
27	(b) The crematory establishment may cremate the deceased

1	person's human remains without receipt of a cremation authorization
2	form signed by the authorizing agent if:
3	(1) cremation costs are paid; and
4	(2) the authorizing agent provides positive written
5	identification that the human remains to be cremated are the human
6	remains of the deceased person.
7	SECTION 12. Section 716.103, Health and Safety Code, is
8	amended to read as follows:
9	Sec. 716.103. IDENTIFICATION RESPONSIBILITY OF CREMATORY.
10	(a) A crematory establishment shall place on the exterior of a
11	cremation container a label with the deceased person's name as
12	provided by the authorizing agent unless the crematory
13	establishment knows the name is incorrect.
14	(b) A crematory establishment shall place, with the
15	cremated remains, in the temporary container, urn, or other
16	permanent container, a permanent metal identification disc,
17	bracelet, or other item that can be used to identify the deceased
18	person.
19	SECTION 13. Section 716.104(a), Health and Safety Code, is
20	amended to read as follows:
21	(a) Except as provided by Section 716.054, a $[A]$ funeral
22	director or funeral establishment shall provide a signed written
23	statement to a crematory establishment that the human remains
24	delivered to the crematory establishment were positively
25	identified as the deceased person listed on the cremation
26	authorization form by the authorizing agent or a representative of
27	the authorizing agent delegated as provided by Section 716.053.

SECTION 14. Section 716.152(d), Health and Safety Code, is
 amended to read as follows:

3 (d) To the extent practicable, the crematory establishment 4 shall remove all recoverable cremation residue from the cremation 5 chamber following cremation and pulverize any bone fragments <u>to a</u> 6 <u>particle size of one-eighth inch or less</u> as necessary. The 7 crematory establishment shall remove and dispose of any other 8 material included with the residue.

9 SECTION 15. Section 716.156(a), Health and Safety Code, is10 amended to read as follows:

(a) A crematory establishment shall:

(1) release the cremated remains to a representative of the funeral establishment that delivered the deceased human remains to the crematory establishment;

(3) ship the remains to the shipping address provided
by the authorizing agent on the cremation authorization form not
later than the 30th day following the date of cremation; or

20	must be removed from the container before being scattered.
21	SECTION 18. Section 716.351(a), Health and Safety Code, is

25	(A) a cremation authorization form signed by an
26	authorizing agent; or
27	(B) written directions for the disposition by

(2) an unincorporated association of plot owners not
 operated for profit;

3 (3) a church, a religious society or denomination, or 4 an entity solely administering the temporalities of a church or 5 religious society or denomination; [or]

6 (4) a public cemetery owned by this state, a county, or
7 a municipality; or

8

(5) a perpetual care cemetery.

9 SECTION 28. Sections 651.354(a), (c), and (d), Occupations
10 Code, are amended to read as follows:

(a) The commission shall mail written notice to a cemetery or funeral establishment of the impending expiration of the stablishment's license not later than the 30th day before the expiration date of the license. <u>The</u> [Except as provided by <u>Subsection (d), the</u>] notice must state that:

12	(b) A perpetual care cemetery is not required to pay a
13	registration fee or renewal fee under this chapter.
14	SECTION 30. Subchapter J, Chapter 651, Occupations Code, is
15	amended by adding Section 651.461 to read as follows:
16	Sec. 651.461. DEFENSE TO VIOLATION. A person licensed
17	under this chapter does not violate this chapter by engaging in
18	conduct regarding funeral arrangements under the direction of a
19	person who:
20	(1) represents to the license holder that the person
21	is authorized to make funeral arrangements for the deceased; and
22	(2) provides written directions to the license holder
23	in the manner provided by Section 711.002, Health and Safety Code.
24	SECTION 31. Section 651.507(a), Occupations Code, is
25	amended to read as follows:
26	(a) The commission or an administrative law judge employed
27	by the State Office of Administrative Hearings shall review each

1 disciplinary proceeding to determine whether the license holder has previously violated [committed] the same provision of this chapter 2 or rule adopted under this chapter [type of violation on one or more 3 previous occasions]. If it is determined that the license holder 4 has previously violated [committed] the same provision of this 5 chapter or rule adopted under this chapter [type of violation], the 6 commission or administrative law judge shall impose a disciplinary 7 8 action that is more severe than that imposed on the previous occasion. 9

SECTION 34. Section 154.265, Finance Code, as added by this 23 Act, applies only to a contract that is entered into on or after the 24 effective date of this Act. A contract entered into before the 25 effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on the 26 date the contract was entered into, and the former law is continued 27

1 in effect for that purpose.

2 SECTION 35. The change in law made by Section 711.0521, Health and Safety Code, as added by this Act, applies only to an 3 offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act. 4 An offense committed before the effective date of this Act is covered 5 by the law in effect when the offense was committed, and the former 6 law is continued in effect for that purpose. For purposes of this 7 8 section, an offense was committed before the effective date of this Act if any element of the offense was committed before that date. 9

10 SECTION 36. Sections 651.165(d), 651.354, and 651.658(d), 11 Occupations Code, as amended by this Act, apply only to a license 12 that expires on or after the effective date of this Act. A license 13 that expired before the effective date of this Act is governed by 14 the law in effect at the time the license expired, and the former 15 law is continued in effect for that purpose.

16 SECTION 37. Section 651.1655, Occupations Code, as added by 17 this Act, applies only to a license suspended on or after the 18 effective date of this Act. A license suspended before the 19 effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect at the 20 time the license was suspended, and the former law is continued in 21 effect for that purpose.

SECTION 38. Section 651.267, Occupations Code, as amended by this Act, applies only to a license revoked on or after the effective date of this Act. A license revoked before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect at the time the license was revoked, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.

1 SECTION 39. Not later than January 1, 2010, the Texas 2 Department of Banking shall provide the initial list of perpetual 3 care cemeteries to the Texas Funeral Service Commission as required 4 by Section 651.355, Occupations Code, as added by this Act.

5 SECTION 40. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
