- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 1053.002(a), Occupations Code, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 (a) This chapter does not apply to:
- 8 (1) a person who:
- 9 (A) does not use the title "interior designer"
- 10 and does not use the term "interior design" to describe a service
- 11 the person offers or performs; and
- 12 (B) is an interior designer licensed or
- 13 registered in another state or country who:
- 14 (i) does not open or maintain a business in
- 15 this state; and
- 16 (ii) complies with the requirements of
- 17 Subsection (b); [or]
- 18 (2) a person who is registered to practice
- 19 architecture in this state; or
- 20 (3) a person who does not use a business or
- 21 professional title that uses the phrase "registered interior
- 22 designer."
- 23 SECTION 2. Section 1053.151, Occupations Code, is amended
- 24 to read as follows:

- 1 Sec. 1053.151. REGISTRATION REQUIRED. A person other than
- 2 an interior designer may not[+
- 3  $\left[\frac{(1)}{(1)}\right]$  represent that the person is <u>a "registered"</u>  $\left[\frac{an}{(1)}\right]$
- 4  $\underline{\text{"}}$ ] interior designer" by using that title or by using words that
- 5 imply that the person is a registered interior designer [; or
- 6 [(2) represent, by using the term "interior design," a
- 7 service the person offers or performs].
- 8 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 9 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 10 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 11 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 12 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
