4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subtitle C, Title 5, Health and Safety Code, is
6	amended by adding Chapter 393 to read as follows:
7	CHAPTER 393. CLIMATE ADAPTATION PLAN
8	Sec. 393.001. PARTICIPATING ENTITIES. Not later than
9	September 1 of each even-numbered year, each of the following
10	entities shall publish a climate adaptation plan that will assess
11	the entity's role with respect to climate change:
12	(1) the Department of Agriculture;
13	(2) the independent organization certified under
14	Section 39.151, Utilities Code;
15	(3) the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality;
16	(4) the General Land Office;
17	(5) the Health and Human Services Commission;
18	(6) the Texas Department of Housing and Community
19	Affairs;
20	(7) the Texas Department of Insurance;
21	(8) the Parks and Wildlife Department;
22	(9) the Department of Public Safety of the State of
23	Texas;
24	(10) the Public Utility Commission of Texas;

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1	(11) the office of the comptroller;
2	(12) the Texas Department of Transportation;
3	(13) the Texas Forest Service; and
4	(14) the Texas Water Development Board.
5	Sec. 393.002. PLAN. (a) For the purposes of this chapter,
6	a climate adaptation plan is a strategy to identify, minimize, and
7	adequately prepare for the effects of global warming on the social,
8	economic, and ecological systems of this state and to manage the
9	risks associated with a changing climate. A plan under this section
10	must be based on current research-based climate science that
11	identifies the likely impacts of rising ambient temperatures on
12	this state.
13	(b) Each climate adaptation plan must include:
14	(1) a climate change vulnerability assessment;
15	(2) a review of existing programs in the context of
16	anticipated changing climate conditions;
17	(3) specific steps necessary for the entity to fulfill
18	its mission during the anticipated climate change;
19	(4) an analysis of the effects implementing the steps
20	identified under Subdivision (3) would have on the entity's budget
21	during the next 2, 5, and 10 years;
22	(5) potential sources of funding to support the
23	entity's efforts to adapt to climate change; and
24	(6) a statewide strategy to monitor the continuing
25	effects of climate change.
26	(c) In developing a climate adaptation plan, each entity
27	subject to this section shall:

- 1 (1) consider the most current assessment reports
- 2 created by the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change;
- 3 (2) consult with the Houston Advanced Research Center;
- 4 and
- 5 (3) consult with the Office of the Texas State
- 6 Climatologist in the Department of Atmospheric Sciences, College of
- 7 Geosciences, Texas A&M University.
- 8 (d) Not later than September 1 of each even-numbered year,
- 9 each entity subject to this section shall post the entity's climate
- 10 adaptation plan on a publicly accessible Internet website and
- 11 electronically submit a copy of the plan to:
- 12 (1) the governor, lieutenant governor, and speaker of
- 13 the house of representatives;
- 14 (2) the presiding officer of each standing committee
- or subcommittee of the legislature with primary jurisdiction over
- 16 environmental matters; and
- 17 (3) the executive director of the Texas Commission on
- 18 Environmental Quality.
- 19 (e) Each climate adaptation plan is subject to audit by the
- 20 state auditor in accordance with Chapter 321, Government Code.
- 21 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 22 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 23 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 24 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 25 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
