- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 264.755, Family Code, is amended by
- 6 amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (d) to read as
- 7 follows:
- 8 (a) The department shall[, subject to the availability of
- 9 funds, enter into a caregiver assistance agreement with each
- 10 relative or other designated caregiver to provide monetary
- 11 assistance and additional support services to the caregiver.
- 12 Subject to Subsection (d), the $[\frac{\text{The}}{\text{The}}]$ monetary assistance and
- 13 support services shall be based on a family's need, as determined by
- 14 rules adopted by the executive commissioner, and be subject to the
- 15 availability of funds.
- 16 <u>(d) A caregiver assistance agreement entered into under</u>
- 17 this section between the department and a relative caregiver who
- 18 will provide substitute care for a child for whom the department has
- 19 been appointed managing conservator must require the department to
- 20 pay monetary assistance to the relative caregiver during the time
- 21 the child is in substitute care. The monetary assistance must be
- 22 paid at a daily rate that is equal to the daily 24-hour residential
- 23 child-care rate that the department would pay for the child if the
- 24 substitute care were provided in a foster home, foster group home,

- 1 agency foster home, or agency foster group home licensed or
- 2 certified under Chapter 42, Human Resources Code, and the child
- 3 were assigned a basic service level.
- 4 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies to a
- 5 caregiver assistance agreement entered into on or after the
- 6 effective date of this Act. A caregiver assistance agreement
- 7 entered into before the effective date of this Act is governed by
- 8 the law in effect on the date the agreement was entered into, and
- the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 10 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
