A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to compensation and employment benefits for members of the
- 3 Texas State Guard called to state active duty.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 431.082, Government Code, is amended by
- 6 amending Subsections (b) and (c) and adding Subsection (d) to read
- 7 as follows:
- 8 (b) A member of the <u>Texas National Guard</u> [state military
- 9 forces who volunteers to perform training or other duty solely
- 10 under state authority may not receive salary or allowances from the
- 11 state for the duty unless the adjutant general authorizes the
- 12 payment, but may be reimbursed for lodging and meals as authorized
- 13 by the General Appropriations Act if the adjutant general
- 14 authorizes the payment. Training or duty without pay is considered
- 15 for all purposes as if it were training or duty with pay.
- 16 (c) When the adjutant general authorizes payment for
- 17 training or other duty under Subsection (b), a member of the Texas
- 18 <u>National Guard</u> [state military forces] performing the training or
- 19 other duty is entitled, during the period of the training or other
- 20 duty, to receive pay and allowances as provided by law for the
- 21 United States Armed Forces, except that the pay may not be less than
- 22 the reimbursement for lodging and meals authorized by the General
- 23 Appropriations Act. This pay is an emolument for training or other
- 24 duty and is salary or base pay. The pay and allowances may not be

- 1 reduced because of food, shelter, or transportation that the state
- 2 pays or furnishes in connection with the training or other duty.
- 3 (d) A member of the Texas State Guard called to state active
- 4 duty is an employee of the state while on state active duty. The
- 5 adjutant general shall pay members of the Texas State Guard called
- 6 to state active duty according to Chapters 654 and 659 and the
- 7 <u>salary schedule</u> in the General Appropriations Act for state
- 8 employees. If the length of state active duty exceeds 45
- 9 consecutive days, the adjutant general may pay the members of the
- 10 Texas State Guard called to state active duty up to 140 percent of
- 11 the amount authorized under the salary schedule in the General
- 12 Appropriations Act.
- SECTION 2. Section 1551.1055, Insurance Code, is amended by
- 14 adding Subsection (e) to read as follows:
- 15 (e) This subsection applies only to a member of the Texas
- 16 State Guard who is called to state active duty. Notwithstanding
- 17 Subsection (a), eligibility under Section 1551.101 begins on the
- 18 first day that a member of the Texas State Guard is called to state
- 19 active duty.
- 20 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 21 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 22 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 23 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 24 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
