A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to certain judicial findings required before a court may order a person to receive extended outpatient mental health 3 services. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 5 6 SECTION 1. Section 574.035(b), Health and Safety Code, is amended to read as follows: 7 (b) The judge may order a proposed patient to receive 8 court-ordered extended outpatient mental health services only if: 9 (1) the judge finds that appropriate mental health 10 services are available to the patient; and 11 12 (2) the jury, or the judge if the right to a jury is waived, finds from clear and convincing evidence that: 13 14 (A) the proposed patient is mentally ill; the nature of the mental illness is severe 15 (B) 16 and persistent; (C) as a result of the mental illness, the 17 proposed patient will, if not treated, continue to: 18 (i) suffer severe and abnormal mental, 19 emotional, or physical distress; and 20 21 (ii) experience deterioration of the ability to function independently to the extent that the proposed 22 23 patient will be unable to live safely in the community without court-ordered outpatient mental health services; 24

No. 1647 1 (D) the proposed patient has an inability to 2 participate in outpatient treatment services effectively and 3 voluntarily, demonstrated by: 4 (i) any of the proposed patient's actions 5 occurring within the two-year period which immediately precedes the hearing; or 6 (ii) specific characteristics 7 of the 8 proposed patient's clinical condition that make impossible a 9 rational and informed decision whether to submit to voluntary outpatient treatment; 10 (E) the proposed patient's condition is expected 11 to continue for more than 90 days; and 12 (F) the patient 13 proposed has received 14 court-ordered inpatient mental health services under this subtitle 15 or under Subchapter D or E, Chapter 46B, Code of Criminal Procedure, for <u>a total of</u> at least 60 [consecutive] days during the preceding 16 17 24 [<del>12</del>] months.

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SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.

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
