A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 1 AN ACT
- 2 relating to the penalty imposed on defaulting jurors.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Section 62.111, Government Code, is amended to
- 5 read as follows:
- 6 Sec. 62.111. PENALTY FOR DEFAULTING JURORS. A juror
- 7 lawfully notified shall be fined not less than $$100 \ [\$10]$ nor more
- 8 than \$500 [\$100] if the juror [he]:
- 9 (1) fails to attend court in obedience to the notice
- 10 without reasonable excuse; or
- 11 (2) files a false claim of exemption from jury
- 12 service.
- 13 SECTION 2. Article 19.16, Code of Criminal Procedure, is
- 14 amended to read as follows:
- Art. 19.16. ABSENT JUROR FINED. A juror legally summoned,
- 16 failing to attend without a reasonable excuse, may, by order of the
- 17 court entered on the record, be fined not less than \$100 [ten
- 18 dollars] nor more than \$500 [one hundred dollars].
- 19 SECTION 3. Article 35.01, Code of Criminal Procedure, is
- 20 amended to read as follows:
- 21 Art. 35.01. JURORS CALLED. When a case is called for trial
- 22 and the parties have announced ready for trial, the names of those
- 23 summoned as jurors in the case shall be called. Those not present
- 24 may be fined not less than \$100 nor more than \$500 [not exceeding

- 1 fifty dollars]. An attachment may issue on request of either party
- 2 for any absent summoned juror, to have him brought forthwith before
- 3 the court. A person who is summoned but not present, may upon an
- 4 appearance, before the jury is qualified, be tried as to his
- 5 qualifications and impaneled as a juror unless challenged, but no
- 6 cause shall be unreasonably delayed on account of his absence.
- 7 SECTION 4. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 8 to a juror who fails to attend or provides a false claim of
- 9 exemption on or after the effective date of this Act. A violation
- 10 that occurred before the effective date of this Act is governed by
- 11 the law in effect when the violation occurred, and the former law is
- 12 continued in effect for that purpose.
- SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
