Subchapter C, Chapter 25, Government Code, is 5 amended by adding Sections 25.1771 and 25.1772 to read as follows: 6 Sec. 25.1771. NAVARRO COUNTY. Navarro County has one 7 statutory county court, the County Court at Law of Navarro County. Sec. 25.1772. NAVARRO COUNTY COURT AT LAW PROVISIONS. (a) 8 9 In addition to the jurisdiction provided by Section 25.0003 and other law, and except as limited by Subsection (b), a county court 10 at law in Navarro County has concurrent jurisdiction with the 11 district court in: 12 (1) felony cases to: 13 14 (A) conduct arraignments; (B) conduct pretrial hearings; 15 16 (C) accept guilty pleas; and (D) conduct jury trials on assignment of a 17 district judge presiding in Navarro County and acceptance of the 18 assignment by the judge of the county court at law; 19 20 (2) Class A and Class B misdemeanor cases; 21 (3) family law matters; (4) juvenile matters; 22 23 (5) probate matters; and 24 (6) appeals from the justice and municipal courts.

No. 1682 1 (b) A county court at law does not have general supervisory 2 control or appellate review of the commissioners court or 3 jurisdiction of: 4 (1) suits on behalf of this state to recover penalties 5 or escheated property; 6 (2) felony cases involving capital murder; 7 (3) misdemeanors involving official misconduct; or 8 (4) contested elections. 9 The judge of a county court at law must have the same (c) 10 qualifications as those required by law for a district judge. (d) The judge of a county court at law shall be paid a total 11 12 annual salary set by the commissioners court at an amount that is not less than \$1,000 less than the total annual salary received by a 13 district judge in the county. A district judge's or statutory 14 15 county court judge's total annual salary does not include contributions and supplements paid by a county. 16 17 (e) The judge of a county court at law may not engage in the private practice of law. 18 19 (f) The district clerk serves as clerk of a county court at law in matters of concurrent jurisdiction with the district court, 20 21 and the county clerk shall serve as clerk of a county court at law in all other matters. Each clerk shall establish a separate docket for 22 23 a county court at law. 24 (g) The official court reporter of a county court at law is entitled to receive a salary set by the judge of the county court at 25 26 law with the approval of the commissioners court. (h) Jurors summoned for a county court at law or a district 27

court in the county may by order of the judge of the court to which 1 they are summoned be transferred to another court for service and 2 may be used as if summoned for the court to which they are 3 4 transferred. 5 SECTION 2. Notwithstanding Section 25.1771, Government 6 Code, as added by this Act, the County Court at Law of Navarro County is created January 1, 2011, or on an earlier date determined 7 by the Commissioners Court of Navarro County by an order entered in 8 its minutes. 9
