## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 relating to optional fees on the registration of a vehicle imposed
- 3 by a county.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 502.172(a), Transportation Code, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 (a) The commissioners court of a county by order may impose
- 8 an additional fee, not to exceed \$15 [\$10], for registering a
- 9 vehicle in the county.
- 10 SECTION 2. Section 502.1725, Transportation Code, is
- 11 amended to read as follows:
- 12 Sec. 502.1725. OPTIONAL COUNTY FEE FOR TRANSPORTATION
- 13 PROJECTS. (a) [This section applies only to a county:
- [(1) that borders the United Mexican States;
- [(2) that has a population of more than 300,000; and
- 16 [(3) in which the largest municipality has a
- 17 population of less than 300,000.
- 18 [<del>(b)</del>] The commissioners court of a county by order may
- 19 impose an additional fee, not to exceed  $\frac{$50}{}$  [ $\frac{$10}{}$ ], for registering a
- 20 vehicle in the county.
- (b)  $[\frac{(c)}{(c)}]$  A vehicle that may be registered under this
- 22 chapter without payment of a registration fee may be registered in a
- 23 county imposing a fee under this section without payment of the
- 24 additional fee.

- 1  $\underline{\text{(c)}}$  [ $\frac{\text{(d)}}{\text{)}}$ ] A fee imposed under this section may take effect
- 2 only on January 1 of a year. The county must adopt the order and
- 3 notify the department not later than September 1 of the year
- 4 preceding the year in which the fee takes effect.
- 5 (d) [<del>(e)</del>] A fee imposed under this section may be
- 6 removed. The removal may take effect only on January 1 of a
- 7 year. A county may remove the fee only by:
- 8 (1) rescinding the order imposing the fee; and
- 9 (2) notifying the department not later than September
- 10 1 of the year preceding the year in which the removal takes effect.
- 11 (e) [<del>(f)</del>] The county assessor-collector of a county
- 12 imposing a fee under this section shall collect the additional fee
- 13 for a vehicle when other fees imposed under this chapter are
- 14 collected. The county shall deposit [send] the fee revenue in a
- 15 special account in the county general fund. Money in the account may
- 16 be used only to contract with:
- 17 (1) [to] the regional mobility authority of the county
- 18 to promote and maintain a public purpose of the county that involves
- 19 funding [fund] long-term transportation projects in the county; or
- 20 (2) a transportation governmental entity designated
- 21 under Subsection (i) to promote and maintain a public purpose of the
- 22 county that involves funding long-term transportation projects in
- 23 the county.
- (f)  $[\frac{g}{g}]$  The department shall collect the additional fee
- 25 on a vehicle that is owned by a resident of a county imposing a fee
- 26 under this section and that, under this chapter, must be registered
- 27 directly with the department. The department shall send all fees

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- 1 collected for a county under this subsection to the county for
- 2 deposit and use as provided by Subsection (e) [regional mobility
- 3 authority of the county to fund long-term transportation projects
- 4 in the county].
- 5 (g) [<del>(h)</del>] The department shall adopt rules and develop
- 6 forms necessary to administer registration by mail for a vehicle
- 7 being registered in a county imposing a fee under this section.
- 8 (h) The total amount of fees imposed by a commissioners
- 9 court of a county under this section and under Section 502.172 may
- 10 not exceed \$65.
- 11 (i) The department shall designate the governmental
- 12 entities that serve primarily a transportation function and with
- 13 which counties may contract under Subsection (e).
- 14 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 15 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 16 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 17 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 18 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
