A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to a requirement that higher education students wear
- 3 reflective clothing or gear while participating in nighttime
- 4 athletic events or activities; providing a penalty.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Subchapter Z, Chapter 51, Education Code, is
- 7 amended by adding Section 51.9505 to read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 51.9505. REFLECTIVE CLOTHING REQUIRED FOR NIGHTTIME
- 9 ATHLETIC EVENTS OR ACTIVITIES. (a) In this section, "institution
- 10 of higher education" and "private or independent institution of
- 11 higher education" have the meanings assigned by Section 61.003.
- 12 (b) Each institution of higher education and each private or
- 13 <u>independent institution of higher education shall require students</u>
- 14 to wear reflective clothing or gear that meets or exceeds the
- 15 minimum standards prescribed under Subsection (g) while the
- 16 students are participating in a nighttime athletic event or
- 17 activity, including a training or practice activity, that is
- 18 sponsored or organized by an institution of higher education or
- 19 private or independent institution of higher education or by an
- 20 <u>intercollegiate organization or association in this state or</u>
- 21 <u>another state.</u>
- (c) The requirement of Subsection (b) does not apply to any
- 23 nighttime athletic event or activity that occurs indoors or within
- 24 a lighted athletic facility.

- 1 (d) An institution that knowingly violates this section is
- 2 subject to a civil penalty in an amount not to exceed the greater
- 3 of:
- 4 (1) \$1,000 for each violation; or
- 5 <u>(2)</u> \$10,000.
- 6 (e) Each day that a violation continues or occurs is a
- 7 separate violation for purposes of imposing a penalty under this
- 8 section.
- 9 (f) The attorney general may sue to collect a civil penalty
- 10 under this section. In the suit the attorney general may recover,
- 11 on behalf of the state, the reasonable expenses incurred in
- 12 obtaining the penalty, including investigation and court costs,
- 13 reasonable attorney's fees, witness fees, and other expenses.
- 14 (g) The Texas <u>Higher Education Coordinating Board shall</u>
- 15 adopt under this section rules prescribing minimum standards for
- 16 the types of reflective clothing or gear to be worn by students and
- 17 for the types of nighttime athletic events or activities during
- 18 which reflective clothing or gear must be worn.
- 19 SECTION 2. (a) Section 51.9505, Education Code, as added by
- 20 this Act, applies to participation in nighttime athletic events or
- 21 activities by students enrolled at public institutions of higher
- 22 education or private or independent institutions of higher
- 23 education during a semester or summer session that begins on or
- 24 after August 1, 2010.
- 25 (b) Not later than June 1, 2010, the Texas Higher Education
- 26 Coordinating Board shall adopt rules in accordance with Section
- 27 51.9505, Education Code, as added by this Act, prescribing minimum

- 1 standards for the types of reflective clothing or gear to be worn
- 2 during nighttime athletic events or activities.
- 3 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 4 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 5 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 6 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 7 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
