7	Sec. 447.015. STATE ENERGY CONSUMPTION AND EXPENDITURES
8	DATABASE. The State Energy Conservation Office shall develop and
9	maintain a database of state agency energy consumption and
10	expenditures. The database must be designed to allow any agency to
11	determine the agency's energy consumption and expenditures in each
12	building occupied by the agency. The database may include the
13	square footage occupied by a state agency in a building.
14	SECTION 2. Subchapter A, Chapter 2165, Government Code, is
15	amended by adding Section 2165.010 to read as follows:
16	Sec. 2165.010. THERMOSTAT SETTINGS IN STATE BUILDINGS. (a)
17	A state agency or institution of higher education in charge and
18	control of a state building shall adjust thermostat settings within
19	industry standards for energy conservation, as determined by the
20	United States Department of Energy, to achieve occupant comfort and
21	to correspond to:
22	(1) seasonal temperature changes; and
23	(2) building occupancy schedules.
24	(b) This section does not apply to a building containing

1 temperature sensitive operations, including computer and 2 laboratory facilities and buildings in which populations live or 3 are served on a 24-hour basis.

4 SECTION 3. Section 388.005(e), Health and Safety Code, as 5 amended by Chapters 262 (S.B. 12) and 939 (H.B. 3693), Acts of the 6 80th Legislature, Regular Session, 2007, is reenacted and amended 7 to read as follows:

political subdivision, 8 (e) A institution of higher education, or state agency annually shall report to the State 9 Energy Conservation Office, on forms provided by that office, 10 regarding the entity's efforts and progress under this section. 11 The report must include the entity's seasonal specific thermostat 12 settings and thermostat settings for nonpeak or off hours. 13 The State Energy Conservation Office shall provide assistance and 14 15 information to the entity to help the entity meet the goals set 16 under this section.
