## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the organization of the adjutant general's department.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Section 431.026, Government Code, is amended to
- 5 read as follows:
- 6 Sec. 431.026. DEPUTY AND ASSISTANT ADJUTANTS GENERAL.
- 7 (a) On recommendation of the adjutant general, the governor shall
- 8 appoint a deputy [an assistant] adjutant general for army[, a
- 9 deputy assistant adjutant general for army, and a deputy [an
- 10 assistant] adjutant general for air. To be qualified for
- 11 appointment a person must have the qualifications required for
- 12 appointment as adjutant general under Section 431.022(b).
- 13 <u>(a-1)</u> The adjutant general shall appoint three assistant
- 14 adjutants general for army and one assistant adjutant general for
- 15 air. The assistant adjutants general shall be paid with federal
- 16 money. The assistant adjutant general positions must be filled by
- 17 regular part-time Texas National Guard members. The adjutant
- 18 general may appoint an additional assistant adjutant general for
- 19 army for every 5,000-person increase in Texas Army National Guard
- 20 personnel from the number of personnel as of September 1, 2009, and
- 21 an additional assistant adjutant general for air for every
- 22 2,000-person increase in Texas Air National Guard personnel from
- 23 the number of personnel as of September 1, 2009.
- 24 (b) Before taking office an appointee shall take and

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- 1 subscribe to the oath of office prescribed for officers of the Texas
- 2 National Guard. This oath shall be filed in the adjutant general's
- 3 office.
- 4 (c) A [An assistant or] deputy or assistant adjutant general
- 5 has the rank prescribed by the governor, not to exceed the grade
- 6 authorized for federal recognition in the position, and is entitled
- 7 to the rights, privileges, and immunities granted officers of that
- 8 rank in the Texas National Guard. The [assistant or] deputy or
- 9 assistant adjutant general may be removed from office by the
- 10 governor.
- 11 (d)  $\underline{A}$  [ $\underline{An}$  assistant or] deputy  $\underline{or}$  assistant adjutant
- 12 general shall aid the adjutant general by performing assigned
- 13 duties. If the adjutant general is dead, absent, or unable to act,
- 14 the deputy [assistant] adjutant general who is senior in rank shall
- 15 perform the duties of the adjutant general.
- SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 17 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 18 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 19 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 20 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
