- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 552.1175(a), Government Code, is amended
- 7 to read as follows:
- 8 (a) This section applies only to:
- 9 (1) peace officers as defined by Article 2.12, Code
- 10 of Criminal Procedure;
- 11 (2) county jailers as defined by Section 1701.001,
- 12 Occupations Code;
- 13 (3) current or former employees of the Texas
- 14 Department of Criminal Justice or of the predecessor in function of
- 15 the department or any division of the department;
- 16 (4) commissioned security officers as defined
- 17 by Section 1702.002, Occupations Code;
- 18 (5) employees of a district attorney, criminal
- 19 district attorney, or county or municipal attorney whose
- 20 jurisdiction includes any criminal law or child protective services
- 21 matters; [and]
- 22 (6) officers and employees of a community supervision
- 23 and corrections department established under Chapter 76 who perform
- 24 a duty described by Section 76.004(b); and

- 1 (7) current and former employees of the office of the
- 2 attorney general who are or were assigned to a division of that
- 3 office the duties of which involve criminal law enforcement.
- 4 SECTION 2. Section 25.025(a), Tax Code, as amended by
- 5 Chapters 594 (H.B. 41), 621 (H.B. 455), and 851 (H.B. 1141), Acts of
- 6 the 80th Legislature, Regular Session, 2007, is reenacted and
- 7 amended to read as follows:
- 8 (a) This section applies only to:
- 9 (1) a current or former peace officer as defined by
- 10 Article 2.12, Code of Criminal Procedure;
- 11 (2) a county jailer as defined by Section 1701.001,
- 12 Occupations Code;
- 13 (3) an employee of the Texas Department of Criminal
- 14 Justice;
- 15 (4) a commissioned security officer as defined by
- 16 Section 1702.002, Occupations Code;
- 17 (5) a victim of family violence as defined by Section
- 18 71.004, Family Code, if as a result of the act of family violence
- 19 against the victim, the actor is convicted of a felony or a Class A
- 20 misdemeanor; [and]
- 21 (6) a federal judge or state judge;
- (7) (6) a current or former employee of a district
- 23 attorney, criminal district attorney, or county or municipal
- 24 attorney whose jurisdiction includes any criminal law or child
- 25 protective services matters;
- (8) $[\frac{(6)}{(6)}]$ an officer or employee of a community
- 27 supervision and corrections department established under Chapter

- 1 76, Government Code, who performs a duty described by Section
- 2 76.004(b) of that code; and
- 3 (9) a current or former employee of the office of the
- 4 attorney general who is or was assigned to a division of that office
- 5 the duties of which involve criminal law enforcement.
- 6 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 7 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 8 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 9 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 10 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
