2	relating to education and examination requirements for the issuance
3	of a driver's license to certain persons.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 521.142(d), Transportation Code, is
6	amended to read as follows:
7	(d) If the applicant is under 25 years of age, the
8	application must state whether the applicant has completed a driver
9	education course <u>required by Section 521.1601</u> [approved by the
10	department].
11	SECTION 2. The heading to Subchapter H, Chapter 521,
12	Transportation Code, is amended to read as follows:
13	SUBCHAPTER H. <u>EDUCATION AND</u> EXAMINATION REQUIREMENTS
14	SECTION 3. Subchapter H, Chapter 521, Transportation Code,
15	is amended by adding Sections 521.1601 and 521.167 to read as
16	follows:
17	Sec. 521.1601. DRIVER EDUCATION REQUIRED. The department
18	may not issue a driver's license to a person who is younger than 25
19	years of age unless the person submits to the department a driver
20	education certificate issued under Chapter 1001, Education Code,
21	that states that the person has completed and passed:
22	(1) a driver education and traffic safety course
23	approved by the Texas Education Agency under Section 29.902,
24	Education Code, or a driver education course approved by that

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agency under Section 1001.101(a)(1) of that code or approved by the 1 department under Section 521.205; or 2 3 (2) if the person is 18 years of age or older, a driver education course approved by the Texas Education Agency under 4 5 Section 1001.101(a)(1) or (2), Education Code. 6 Sec. 521.167. WAIVER OF CERTAIN EDUCATION AND EXAMINATION 7 REQUIREMENTS. (a) A person who has completed and passed a driver 8 education and traffic safety course approved by the Texas Education Agency under Section 29.902, Education Code, or a driver education 9 10 course approved by that agency under Section 1001.101(a)(1) of that code or approved by the department under Section 521.205 is not 11 12 required to: (1) complete a driver education course established 13 14 under Section 1001.101(a)(2), Education Code; or 15 (2) take any part of the examination required under Section 521.161(b)(2) that: 16 (A) is included under the behind-the-wheel 17 components of a driver education course; and 18 19 (B) has been successfully completed as determined by an appropriately licensed or certified driver 20 education instructor or by a relative or guardian approved by the 21 department under Section 521.205 to conduct a driver education 22 23 course for the person. 24 (b) A person who has completed and passed a driver education course approved by the Texas Education Agency under Section 25 26 1001.101(a)(2), Education Code, is not required to take the highway sign and traffic law parts of the examination required under 27

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Section 521.161 if those parts have been successfully completed as determined by a licensed driver education instructor.

3 SECTION 4. Sections 521.165(a) and (c), Transportation 4 Code, are amended to read as follows:

5 (a) The director may certify and set standards for the 6 certification of certain employers, government agencies, <u>public</u> 7 <u>schools conducting a driver education and traffic safety program</u> 8 <u>under Section 29.902, Education Code,</u> and other appropriate 9 organizations, <u>including a driver education school licensed under</u> 10 <u>Chapter 1001, Education Code,</u> to allow those persons to train and 11 test for the ability to operate certain types of vehicles.

(c) In issuing a driver's license for certain types of vehicles, the director <u>shall</u> [may] waive a driving test for an applicant who has successfully completed and passed the training and testing conducted by a person certified under Subsection (a).

SECTION 5. Section 521.1655, Transportation Code, is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 521.1655. TESTING BY DRIVER EDUCATION SCHOOL. (a) A driver education school licensed under <u>Chapter 1001, Education</u> <u>Code, [the Texas Driver and Traffic Safety Education Act (Article</u> 4413(29c), <u>Vernon's Texas Civil Statutes</u>] may administer to a student of that school the [vision,] highway sign[,] and traffic law parts of the examination required by Section 521.161.

(b) An examination administered under this section complies with the examination requirements of this subchapter as to the parts of the examination administered. <u>The department shall accept</u> the passing results of an examination administered under this

1 section.

2 SECTION 6. Section 521.204(a), Transportation Code, is 3 amended to read as follows:

4 (a) The department may issue a Class C driver's license to 5 an applicant under 18 years of age only if the applicant:

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is 16 years of age or older;

7 (2) has submitted to the department a driver education 8 certificate issued under Chapter 1001, Education Code [Section 9A, Texas Driver and Traffic Safety Education Act (Article 4413(29c), 9 10 Vernon's Texas Civil Statutes)], that states that the person has completed and passed <u>a driver education and traffic safety course</u> 11 12 approved by the Texas Education Agency under Section 29.902, Education Code, or a driver education course approved by that 13 14 agency under Section 1001.101(a)(1) of that code or approved by the 15 department under Section 521.205 [or by the Texas Education 16 Agency];

17 (3) has obtained a high school diploma or its 18 equivalent or is a student:

(A) enrolled in a public school, home school, or
private school who attended school for at least <u>90 percent of</u> [80
days in] the fall or spring semester preceding the date of the
driver's license application; or

(B) who has been enrolled for at least 45 days,
and is enrolled as of the date of the application, in a program to
prepare persons to pass the high school equivalency exam; and

26 (4) has passed the examination required by Section27 521.161.

1 SECTION 7. Section 1001.004, Education Code, is amended to
2 read as follows:

3 Sec. 1001.004. COST OF ADMINISTERING CHAPTER. (a) Except 4 <u>as provided by Subsection (b), the</u> [The] cost of administering this 5 chapter shall be included in the state budget allowance for the 6 agency.

7 (b) The commissioner may charge a fee to each driver 8 education school in an amount not to exceed the actual expense 9 incurred in the regulation of driver education courses established 10 under Section 1001.101(a)(2).

11 SECTION 8. Section 1001.055, Education Code, is amended by 12 amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (d) to read as 13 follows:

(a) The agency shall print and supply to each licensed or
exempt driver education school driver education certificates to be
used for certifying completion of an approved driver education
course to satisfy the requirements of <u>Sections</u> [Section]
521.204(a)(2) and 521.1601, Transportation Code. The certificates
must be numbered serially.

20 <u>(d) A licensed or exempt driver education school shall</u> 21 <u>electronically submit to the agency in the manner established by</u> 22 <u>the agency data identified by the agency relating to driver</u> 23 <u>education certificates issued by the school.</u>

24 SECTION 9. Section 1001.101, Education Code, is amended to 25 read as follows:

26 Sec. 1001.101. DRIVER EDUCATION COURSE CURRICULUM AND 27 <u>EDUCATIONAL MATERIALS</u> [TEXTBOOKS]. <u>(a)</u> The commissioner by rule

shall establish the curriculum and designate the educational 1 materials [textbooks] to be used in: 2 3 (1) a driver education course for minors and adults; 4 and 5 (2) a driver education course exclusively for adults. (b) A driver education course under Subsection (a)(2) must: 6 (1) be a six-hour course; and 7 8 (2) include instruction in: (A) alcohol and drug awareness; 9 (B) the traffic laws of this state; 10 (C) highway signs, signals, and markings that 11 12 regulate, warn, or direct traffic; and (D) the issues commonly associated with motor 13 vehicle accidents, including poor decision-making, risk taking, 14 15 impaired driving, distraction, speed, failure to use a safety belt, driving at night, failure to yield the right-of-way, and using a 16 17 wireless communication device while operating a vehicle. (c) A course approved under Subsection (a)(2) may be offered 18 19 as an online course. (d) A driving safety course or a drug and alcohol driving 20 21 awareness program may not be approved as a driver education course under Subsection (a)(2). 22 23 SECTION 10. The changes in law made by this Act apply to an 24 application for the issuance of a driver's license filed on or after 25 the effective date of this Act. An application for the issuance of a driver's license filed before the effective date of this Act is 26 governed by the law in effect on the date of the filing, and that law 27

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1 is continued in effect for that purpose.

2 SECTION 11. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
