2-8 SECTION 5. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to 2-9 license applications and renewals filed on or after the effective 2-10 date of this Act. A license application or renewal filed before the 2-11 effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect at the 2-12 time the application or renewal was filed, and the former law is 2-13 continued in effect for that purpose.

2-14 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 2-15 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 2-16 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 2-17 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 2-18 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.

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
