5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Chapter 26, Education Code, is amended by adding
7	Section 26.015 to read as follows:
8	Sec. 26.015. AGREEMENT REGARDING RESPONSIBILITIES OF
9	PARENT, STUDENT, AND CLASSROOM TEACHER. (a) This section applies
10	only to a school district that:
11	(1) has a student enrollment of not more than 35,000;
12	(2) is located in a county that has a population of at
13	least 3.4 million; and
14	(3) borders one or more school districts, each of
15	which has a student enrollment of at least 40,000.
16	(b) A school district to which this section applies shall
17	adopt a written agreement form for each grade level that specifies
18	the responsibilities of a student's parent as well as the
19	respective responsibilities of the student and each of the
20	student's classroom teachers. The parent, the student, and a
21	school district designee shall sign the appropriate agreement at
22	the beginning of each school year.
23	(c) A student in prekindergarten, kindergarten, grade one,
24	grade two, or grade three is not required to sign the agreement

2 <u>(d) A school district to which this section applies shall</u>
3 <u>determine the manner in which the agreement will be enforced,</u>
4 <u>including any fines or other penalties for an individual's refusal</u>
5 <u>to sign the agreement or satisfy the individual's responsibilities</u>
6 <u>under the agreement.</u>
7 <u>(e) This section expires June 1, 2013.</u>

8 SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2009-2010 9 school year.

10 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 11 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 12 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 13 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 14 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
