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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to regulation of the practice of barbering. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Section 1601.002, Occupations Code, is amended 4 5 to read as follows: Sec. 1601.002. DEFINITION OF BARBERING. In this chapter, 6 7 "barbering," "practicing barbering," or the "practice of barbering" means: 8 9 (1) performing or offering or attempting to perform for compensation or the promise of compensation any of the 10 11 following services: 12 (A) treating a person's mustache or beard by 13 arranging, beautifying, coloring, processing, shaving, styling, or 14 trimming; (B) treating a person's hair by: 15 16 (i) arranging, beautifying, bleaching, 17 cleansing, coloring, curling, dressing, dyeing, processing, shampooing, shaping, singeing, straightening, styling, tinting, or 18 19 waving; 20 (ii) providing a necessary service that is preparatory or ancillary to a service under Subparagraph (i), 21 including bobbing, clipping, cutting, or trimming; or 22 23 (iii) cutting the person's hair as a 24 separate and independent service for which a charge is directly or

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1 (2) advertising or representing to the public in any 2 manner that a person is a barber or is authorized to practice 3 barbering; or

4 (3) advertising or representing to the public in any
5 manner that a location or place of business is a barbershop,
6 specialty shop, or barber school.

7 SECTION 2. Section 1601.051, Occupations Code, is amended 8 to read as follows:

9 Sec. 1601.051. BOARD; MEMBERSHIP. The Advisory Board on 10 Barbering consists of five members appointed by the presiding 11 officer of the commission, with the commission's approval, as 12 follows:

13 (1)

(1) two members, each of whom:

14 (A) is engaged in the practice of barbering as a15 Class A barber; and

16 (B) does not <u>own a barbershop or franchise</u> [hold 17 a barbershop permit];

18 (2) two members, each of whom is a barbershop owner who19 holds a barbershop permit; and

20 (3) one member who holds a permit to conduct or operate21 a barber school.

22 SECTION 3. Section 1601.303, Occupations Code, is amended 23 to read as follows:

Sec. 1601.303. ISSUANCE OF BARBERSHOP PERMIT. The department shall issue a barbershop permit to an applicant if: (1) the applicant owns the barbershop;

27 (2) the applicant verifies the application; [and]

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(3) the shop meets the minimum health standards for
 barbershops set by the commission and complies with all other
 commission rules; and

4 (4) the shop employs a barber certified under Section
5 <u>1601.253</u>.

6 SECTION 4. (a) The change in law made by this Act to the 7 Advisory Board on Barbering does not affect the entitlement of a 8 member serving on the board immediately before the effective date 9 of this Act to serve the remainder of the member's term.

10 (b) The change in law to Section 1601.303, Occupations Code, 11 as amended by this Act, applies only to a permit application 12 submitted on or after the effective date of this Act. An 13 application submitted before the effective date of this Act is 14 governed by the law in effect on the date the application was 15 submitted, and the former law is continued in effect for that 16 purpose.

SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
