A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. (a) The executive commissioner of the Health
- 7 and Human Services Commission shall conduct a study to determine
- 8 the costs and benefits to this state of initiating a pilot program
- 9 to provide services to adult persons with autism and other related
- 10 disabilities with similar support needs.
- 11 (b) The study will determine the costs and benefits of a
- 12 pilot program based on a program designed to:
- 13 (1) encourage sustainable employment and community
- 14 integration through specialized supports coordination, case
- 15 management, vocational assessment, training, and support to
- 16 increase job skills and competitive employment opportunities;
- 17 (2) develop meaningful community-based activities for
- 18 persons for whom competitive employment is not a goal;
- 19 (3) promote continued individual development and
- 20 avoid regression;
- 21 (4) promote self-determination and independence;
- 22 (5) coordinate services and behavioral supports
- 23 across all areas of need; and
- 24 (6) allow for flexible funding and for a flexible

- 16 (e) The report required under Subsection (d) of this section
- 17 must include:
- 18 (1) a recommendation for the structure of a pilot
- 19 program;
- 20 (2) a recommendation on the choice of an appropriate
- 21 agency to design and administer a pilot program;
- 22 (3) an estimation of the number of persons who may
- 23 benefit from a pilot program if a program similar to the pilot
- 24 program were instituted statewide;
- 25 (4) an estimation of the potential costs of the pilot
- 26 program and whether the pilot program may lead to savings;
- 27 (5) a method of determining which persons would be

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- 1 eligible to participate in the pilot program; and
- 2 (6) which Medicaid waiver programs are appropriate to
- 3 the pilot program and whether new Medicaid waiver programs may be
- 4 required.
- 5 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 6 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 7 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 8 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 9 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
