- 1 AN ACT
- 2 relating to the safety of the fresh fruit and vegetables produced in
- 3 this state.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that:
- 6 (1) the agricultural industry is a vital part of this
- 7 state's economy, annually contributing \$103 billion, or 9.2 percent
- 8 of the gross state product, and is the state's second largest
- 9 resource-based industry, with one in seven Texans being employed in
- 10 some segment of the agricultural industry;
- 11 (2) food safety must be a top state priority because an
- 12 accidental or deliberate contamination of food or crops could be
- 13 detrimental to the state's economy and would undermine consumer
- 14 confidence in the integrity of food safety in this state;
- 15 (3) the growing and processing of fresh fruits and
- 16 vegetables is crucial to this state, and since September 11, 2001,
- 17 awareness of the threat of contamination of those products has
- 18 increased; and
- 19 (4) this state should increase awareness of food
- 20 safety among its growers and packers of fresh fruits and vegetables
- 21 to avoid disastrous events.
- SECTION 2. Subchapter A, Chapter 91, Agriculture Code, is
- 23 amended by adding Section 91.009 to read as follows:
- Sec. 91.009. COORDINATION OF FOOD SAFETY. (a) The

- 1 department is the lead agency for education and training and shall
- 2 assist the fresh fruit and vegetable industries with food safety
- 3 issues and may provide assistance to federal agencies in their
- 4 implementation of voluntary guidelines relating to sound
- 5 agricultural practices.
- 6 (b) The department shall coordinate, plan, and approve
- 7 training and awareness programs for producers and packers of fresh
- 8 fruits and vegetables. A program under this subsection must inform
- 9 and educate producers and packers regarding:
- 10 (1) sound agricultural practices;
- 11 (2) proper food handling procedures;
- 12 (3) the prevention of accidental or deliberately
- 13 planned outbreaks of disease; and
- 14 (4) the enhancement of overall food safety.
- 15 (c) The department shall coordinate the planning and
- 16 implementation of programs required by Subsection (b) with:
- 17 (1) colleges and universities in this state;
- 18 (2) the Texas AgriLife Extension Service;
- 19 (3) Texas AgriLife Research;
- 20 (4) the Department of State Health Services; and
- 21 <u>(5) private industry.</u>
- 22 (d) The department may adopt rules to implement this
- 23 section. In the development of rules for the certification of
- 24 approved food safety curriculum or training, the department shall
- 25 consult and coordinate with the Department of State Health
- 26 Services.
- 27 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives

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- 1 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 2 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 3 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 4 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
