3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Subtitle F, Title 2, Health and Safety Code, is
5	amended by adding Chapter 123 to read as follows:
6	CHAPTER 123. PUBLIC HEALTH EXTENSION SERVICE
7	PILOT PROGRAM
8	Sec. 123.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
9	(1) "Department" means the Department of State Health
10	Services.
11	(2) "Executive commissioner" means the executive
12	commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission.
13	(3) "Program" means the public health extension
14	service pilot program established under this chapter.
15	Sec. 123.002. PROGRAM ESTABLISHED; PURPOSES. The
16	department shall establish a public health extension service pilot
17	program in Health Service Region 11, a region of the state that may
18	be particularly vulnerable to biosecurity threats, disaster, and
19	other emergencies. The purpose of the program is to:
20	(1) support local public health and medical
21	infrastructure and promote:
22	(A) disease control and medical preparedness;
23	and
24	(B) biosecurity and the detection of the

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1 introduction of dangerous biologic agents, enhanced availability 2 of environmental and toxicologic pathology services, and 3 management of hazardous materials; and 4 (2) evaluate the effectiveness of a public health 5 extension service program for regions of the state that may be particularly vulnerable to biosecurity threats, disaster, and 6 7 other emergencies. 8 Sec. 123.003. RULES. The executive commissioner may adopt rules for the implementation and administration of the program. 9 10 Sec. 123.004. PROGRAM ADMINISTRATION. The department may contract with The Texas A&M University System or The University of 11 12 Texas System, or both systems, to implement or administer all or any 13 part of the program. Sec. 123.005. PROGRAM OBJECTIVES. Through the program, the 14 15 department may implement projects and systems to accomplish the purposes of the program described by Section 123.002, and may: 16 17 (1) provide support for regional disaster medical assistance teams and tactical medical operations incident 18 management teams; 19 (2) establish a disaster training and exercise 20 21 program; (3) establish and equip caches to ensure local 22 availability of necessary medical supplies and equipment for use in 23 24 disasters and other emergencies; (4) establish a regionally based system of emergency 25 26 medical logistics management to support state and federal emergency management authorities that includes: 27

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1 (A) local patient triage sites; and 2 (B) local emergency medical operations; and (5) establish a regionally based system to provide 3 4 technical assistance for disaster mitigation and recovery. Sec. 123.006. REPORT. Not later than December 1, 2010, the 5 6 department shall report to the governor, lieutenant governor, and speaker of the house of representatives on the program. The report 7 shall include recommendations for continuation of the program and 8 expansion of the program to other regions of the state that may be 9 particularly vulnerable to biosecurity threats, disaster, and 10 other emergencies. 11 Sec. 123.007. EXPIRATION. This chapter expires and the 12 program is abolished September 2, 2011. 13 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 14 15 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 16 17 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2009. 18

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
