A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

1-9 relating to an e-prescribing implementation plan under the Medicaid 1-10 and child health plan programs. 1-11 1-12

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

VENDOR DRUG PROGRAM; E-PRESCRIBING. (a) In this SECTION 1. section:

- "Child health plan program" means the child health plan program under Chapter 62, Health and Safety Code.
- (2) "Electronic media" has the meaning assigned by 45 C.F.R. Section 160.103.
- (3) "E-prescribing" means the transmission using electronic media of prescription or prescription-related information between a practitioner, pharmacist, pharmacy benefit manager, or health plan, either directly or through an including through a network. The term includes intermediary, two-way transmissions between the point of care and the pharmacist.

 (4) "Medicaid program" means the medical assistance
- program under Chapter 32, Human Resources Code.

 (5) "Pharmacist," "pharmacy," and "practitioner" have the meanings assigned by Section 551.003, Occupations Code.
- (6) "Prescription-related information" information regarding eligibility for drug benefits, medication history, or related health or drug information for an individual who is receiving benefits under the Medicaid program or the child health plan program.
- The Health and Human Services Commission shall develop (b) an e-prescribing implementation plan under the vendor drug program for the Medicaid and child health plan programs designed to improve patient safety and standardize electronic prescribing systems used in the program. The plan must establish:
- (1) e-prescribing standards with which pharmacists, practitioners, pharmacy benefit managers, and health plans that transmit, directly or through an intermediary, prescriptions for Medicaid program recipients and child health plan program enrollees and prescription-related information using electronic media must comply; and
- pharmacists, (2) time frames within which practitioners, pharmacy benefit managers, and health plans must comply with the standards established under Subdivision (1) of this subsection.
- (c) Not later than December 1, 2009, the Health and Human Services Commission shall submit an initial report to the governor and the Legislative Budget Board detailing the e-prescribing implementation plan developed under this section. The report must include the projected expenditures and cost savings anticipated for the plan during the state fiscal year.
- (d) Not later than December 1, 2010, the Health and Human Services Commission shall submit a final report to the governor and Legislative Budget Board regarding the e-prescribing implementation plan developed under this section. The report must include expenditures associated with and cost savings realized from the plan.

SECTION 2. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members 1-60 1-61 1-62 elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas 1-63 Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for 1-64 immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2009.

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
