A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to distilled spirits samplings by the holder of a 3 distiller's and rectifier's permit. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. Section 14.01, Alcoholic Beverage Code, 5 is amended by amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (c) to 6 read as follows: 7 (a) The holder of a distiller's and rectifier's permit may: 8 9 manufacture distilled spirits; rectify, purify, and refine distilled spirits and 10 (2) 11 wines; 12 (3) mix wines, distilled spirits, or other liquors; 13 (4) bottle, label, and package the permit holder's 14 [his] finished products; (5) sell the finished products in this state to 15 holders of wholesaler's permits and to qualified persons outside 16 the state; [and] 17 18 (6) import distilled spirits, to be used only for manufacturing or rectification purposes, from holders 19 of 20 nonresident seller's permits; and 21 (7) dispense free distilled spirits for consumption on 22 the permitted premises. (c) The holder of a distiller's and rectifier's permit may 23 dispense distilled spirits for consumption on the permitted 24

1	premises under Section 14.04.
2	SECTION 2. Chapter 14, Alcoholic Beverage Code, is amended
3	by adding Section 14.04 to read as follows:
4	Sec. 14.04. DISTILLED SPIRITS SAMPLING. (a) The holder of
5	a distiller's and rectifier's permit may conduct distilled spirits
6	samplings on the permitted premises.
7	(b) A sampling event authorized by this section may not be
8	advertised except by on-site communication or by direct mail.
9	(c) A person other than the holder of a permit or the
10	holder's agent or employee may not dispense or participate in the
11	dispensing of distilled spirits under this section.
12	(d) A person authorized to dispense distilled spirits under
13	this section may not:
14	(1) serve a person more than one sample of each brand
15	of distilled spirits being served at a sampling event; or
16	(2) serve a sample to a minor or to an obviously
17	intoxicated person.
18	(e) Sample portions served at a distilled spirits sampling
19	event may not exceed one-half ounce.
20	(f) A person who receives a sample may not remove the sample
21	from the permitted premises.
22	(g) For the purposes of this code and any other law of this
23	state or a political subdivision of this state, the holder of a
24	permit, during the sampling of distilled spirits under this
25	section, is:
26	(1) not the holder of a permit authorizing the sale of
27	alcoholic beverages for on-premises consumption; and

(2) not considered to have received any revenue from
the on-premises sale of alcoholic beverages.
SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this

7 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
