17	(b) The governor may assist a political subdivision that is
18	the locus of temporary housing <u>or emergency shelters</u> for disaster
19	victims to acquire sites necessary for temporary housing <u>or</u>
20	emergency shelters and to do all things required to prepare the
21	sites to receive and use temporary housing units or emergency
22	shelters by:
23	(1) advancing or lending funds available to the

2 (2) allocating funds made available by a public or3 private agency; or

4 (3) becoming a copartner with the political 5 subdivision for the execution and performance of any temporary 6 housing <u>or emergency shelter project</u> for disaster victims.

7 Under regulations prescribed by the governor, (c) the 8 governor may temporarily suspend or modify for a period of not more than 60 days any public health, safety, zoning, intrastate 9 10 transportation, or other law or regulation if by proclamation the governor considers the suspension or modification essential to 11 12 provide temporary housing or emergency shelter for disaster victims. 13

14 (d) Any political subdivision may temporarily or 15 permanently acquire by lease, purchase, or other means sites required for installation of temporary housing units or emergency 16 17 shelters for disaster victims and may enter into arrangements necessary to prepare or equip the sites to use the housing units or 18 19 shelters, including arrangements for the purchase of temporary housing units or shelters and the payment of transportation 20 21 charges.

(e) A political subdivision that is the locus of temporary housing or emergency shelters for persons moved or evacuated by recommendation or order of the governor may be assisted by any resource available to the state, including the disaster contingency fund, to ensure the political subdivision receives an advance or reimbursement:

1	(1) of all expenses, including lost revenue, incurred
2	by the political subdivision associated with the use of public
3	facilities for temporary housing or emergency shelters; and
4	(2) of the amounts paid for salaries and benefits of
5	permanently employed, straight-time and regular-time personnel of
6	the political subdivision who perform duties associated with the
7	movement or evacuation of persons into, out of, or through the
8	political subdivision.
9	SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
