Section 54.208, Education Code, is amended to 6 7 read as follows: Sec. 54.208. FIREFIGHTERS [FIREMEN] ENROLLED IN FIRE 8 SCIENCE COURSES. (a) The governing board of an institution of 9 higher education [boards of the state institutions of collegiate 10 rank supported in whole or in part by public funds] shall exempt 11 from the payment of tuition and laboratory fees any student 12 enrolled in one or more courses offered as part of a fire science 13 14 curriculum who: (1) [person who] is employed as a firefighter 15 16 [fireman] by a [any] political subdivision of this [the] state; or (2) is an active member of an organized volunteer fire 17 department in this state, as defined by the fire fighters' pension 18 19 commissioner, who holds: 20 (A) an Accredited Advanced level of certification, or an equivalent successor certification, under the 21 State Firemen's and Fire Marshal's Association of Texas volunteer 22 certification program; or 23 24 (B) Phase V (Firefighter II) certification, or an

5 (b) An [The] exemption provided <u>under this section</u> does not 6 apply to deposits <u>that</u> [which] may be required in the nature of 7 security for the return or proper care of property loaned for the 8 use of students.

9 SECTION 2. The changes in law made by this Act to Section 10 54.208, Education Code, apply beginning with tuition and laboratory 11 fees charged for the 2009 fall semester. Tuition and laboratory 12 fees charged for an academic period before the 2009 fall semester 13 are covered by the law in effect immediately before the effective 14 date of this Act, and the former law is continued in effect for that 15 purpose.

16 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 17 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 18 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 19 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 20 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
