A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to tuition and laboratory fee exemptions at public institutions of higher education for certain volunteer 3 firefighters enrolled in fire science courses. 4 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Section 54.208, Education Code, is amended to 6 7 read as follows: Sec. 54.208. <u>FIREFIGHTERS</u> [FIREMEN] ENROLLED IN FIRE 8 SCIENCE COURSES. (a) The governing board of an institution of 9 higher education [boards of the state institutions of collegiate 10 rank supported in whole or in part by public funds] shall exempt 11 12 from the payment of tuition and laboratory fees any student enrolled in one or more courses offered as part of a fire science 13 14 curriculum who: (1) [person who] 15 is employed as a firefighter 16 [fireman] by a [any] political subdivision of this [the] state; or (2) is an active member of an organized volunteer fire 17 department in this state who holds: 18 19 (A) an Accredited Advanced level of certification, or an equivalent successor certification, under the 20 State Firemen's and Fire Marshal's Association of Texas volunteer 21 22 certification program; or 23 (B) Phase V (Firefighter II) certification, or an equivalent successor certification, under the Texas Commission on 24

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Fire Protection's voluntary certification program under Section 419.071, Government Code [and who enrolls in a course or courses offered as part of a fire science curriculum].

(b) An [The] exemption provided <u>under this section</u> does not
apply to deposits <u>that</u> [which] may be required in the nature of
security for the return or proper care of property loaned for the
use of students.

8 SECTION 2. The changes in law made by this Act to Section 9 54.208, Education Code, apply beginning with tuition and laboratory 10 fees charged for the 2009 fall semester. Tuition and laboratory 11 fees charged for an academic period before the 2009 fall semester 12 are covered by the law in effect immediately before the effective 13 date of this Act, and the former law is continued in effect for that 14 purpose.

15 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 16 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 17 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 18 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 19 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.

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
