- 4 providing a penalty.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 521.001(a), Transportation Code, is
- 7 amended by adding Subdivision (7-a) to read as follows:
- 8 (7-a) "Resident" means a person who lives in this state
- 9 and has maintained residency in this state for a period of at least
- 10 60 days at the time of application for a driver's license or
- 11 personal identification certificate.
- 12 SECTION 2. Section 521.029, Transportation Code, is amended
- 13 to read as follows:
- 14 Sec. 521.029. OPERATION OF MOTOR VEHICLE BY NEW STATE
- 15 RESIDENTS. (a) A person who enters this state as a new resident
- 16 may operate a motor vehicle in this state for no more than 90 [30]
- 17 days after the date on which the person enters this state if the
- 18 person:
- 19 (1) is 16 years of age or older; and
- 20 (2) has in the person's possession a driver's license
- 21 issued to the person by the person's state or country of previous
- 22 residence.
- 23 (b) If a person subject to this section is prosecuted for
- 24 operating a motor vehicle without a driver's license, the

- 1 prosecution alleges that the person has resided in this state for
- 2 more than 90 $[\frac{30}{30}]$ days, and the person claims to have been covered
- 3 by Subsection (a), the person must prove by the preponderance of the
- 4 evidence that the person has not resided in this state for more than
- 5 90 [30] days.
- 6 SECTION 3. Section 521.054, Transportation Code, is amended
- 7 by adding Subsection (e) to read as follows:
- 8 (e) A person commits an offense if, with intent to defraud
- 9 or harm another, the person fails or refuses to comply with
- 10 Subsection (b) or (c). An offense under this subsection is a Class
- 11 <u>A misdemeanor.</u>
- 12 SECTION 4. Section 521.142, Transportation Code, is amended
- 13 by amending Subsections (a) and (e) and adding Subsection (i) to
- 14 read as follows:
- 15 (a) An application for an original license must state the
- 16 applicant's full name and place and date of birth. This information
- 17 must be verified by presentation of proof of identity satisfactory
- 18 to the department. The department must accept [as satisfactory
- 19 proof of identity under this subsection] an offender identification
- 20 card or similar form of identification issued to an inmate by the
- 21 Texas Department of Criminal Justice.
- (e) The application must include any other information the
- 23 department requires to determine the applicant's identity,
- 24 <u>residency</u>, competency, and eligibility.
- 25 <u>(i) The department by rule may establish and implement a</u>
- 26 process to verify that the applicant resides at the residence
- 27 address furnished by the applicant. The department may deny

- 1 issuance of a license to an applicant whose residence address
- 2 cannot be verified. This subsection does not apply to a person
- 3 described by Section 521.027.
- 4 SECTION 5. Section 521.181, Transportation Code, is amended
- 5 to read as follows:
- 6 Sec. 521.181. ISSUANCE OF DRIVER'S LICENSE. (a) Or
- 7 payment of the required fee, the department shall issue to each
- 8 qualifying applicant a driver's license of the class for which the
- 9 applicant has applied.
- 10 (b) The department may not deny the issuance of a driver's
- 11 license to an applicant who has otherwise established the
- 12 applicant's identity, residency, competency, and eligibility for
- 13 the driver's license in compliance with the express provisions of
- 14 this chapter.
- 15 <u>(c)</u> The Public Safety Commission or the department may not
- 16 adopt or enforce a rule that is inconsistent with this section.
- 17 SECTION 6. Section 522.021(c-1), Transportation Code, is
- 18 amended to read as follows:
- 19 (c-1) If the department requires proof of an applicant's
- 20 identity as part of an application under this section, the
- 21 department must accept [as satisfactory proof of identity] an
- 22 offender identification card or similar form of identification
- 23 issued to an inmate by the Texas Department of Criminal Justice.
- SECTION 7. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to
- 25 an application for a driver's license, commercial driver's license,
- 26 or personal identification certificate filed on or after the
- 27 effective date of this Act. An application filed before the

- 1 effective date of this Act is subject to the law in effect on the
- 2 date of filing, and that law is continued in effect for that
- 3 purpose.
- 4 SECTION 8. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
