- DOCUMENTS. (a) Subject to the requirements and limitations of this 8
- 9 section, the supreme court, the court of criminal appeals, or a
- court of appeals, at the discretion of the court's chief justice or 10
- presiding judge, as applicable, may designate a museum as an 11
- official repository for the public display of historic court 12
- documents and may transfer those documents to the designated 13

- (b) To be designated as an official repository under this 15
- 16 section, a museum must be exempt from taxation under Section
- 501(a), Internal Revenue Code of 1986, by being listed under 17
- Section 501(c)(3), Internal Revenue Code of 1986. 18
- (c) A document may be transferred to the custody of an 19
- official repository only: 20
- 21 (1) after the final disposition of the case or
- proceeding in which the document was filed; and 22

- 1 (d) The following may not be transferred to the custody of
- 2 <u>an official repository:</u>
- 3 (1) a document contained in a court record that is
- 4 sealed in accordance with law; or
- 5 (2) a document that, at the time the case or proceeding
- 6 in which the document was filed was pending, a person with respect
- 7 to whom the document relates was a minor or otherwise
- 8 incapacitated.
- 9 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 10 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 11 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 12 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 13 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
