1-8 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
1-9 AN ACT

1-10 relating to the certification of a county jailer as a special
1-11 officer for offenders with mental impairments.

1-12 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-13 SECTION 1. Section 1701.404, Occupations Code, is amended
1-14 to read as follows:

1-15 Sec. 1701.404. CERTIFICATION OF OFFICERS FOR MENTAL HEALTH
1-16 ASSIGNMENTS. (a) The commission by rule may establish minimum
1-17 requirements for the training, testing, and certification of
1-18 special officers for offenders with mental impairments.

1-19 (b) The commission may certify a sheriff, sheriff's deputy,
1-20 constable, ~~or~~ other peace officer, county jailer, or ~~a~~ justice
1-21 of the peace~~[-]~~ as a special officer for offenders with mental
1-22 impairments if the person ~~officer~~:

1-23 (1) completes a training course in emergency first aid
1-24 and lifesaving techniques approved by the commission;

1-25 (2) completes a training course administered by the
1-26 commission on mental health issues and offenders with mental
1-27 impairments; and

1-28 (3) passes an examination administered by the
1-29 commission that is designed to test the person's ~~officer's~~:

1-30 (A) knowledge and recognition of the
1-31 characteristics and symptoms of mental illness, mental
1-32 retardation, and mental disabilities; and

1-33 (B) knowledge of mental health crisis
1-34 intervention strategies for people with mental impairments.

1-35 (c) The commission may issue a professional achievement or
1-36 proficiency certificate to an officer, county jailer, or justice of
1-37 the peace who meets the requirements of Subsection (b).

1-38 SECTION 2. (a) The Commission on Law Enforcement Officer
1-39 Standards and Education may certify a county jailer as a special
1-40 officer for offenders with mental impairments and may issue a
1-41 certificate to the county jailer if the county jailer meets the
1-42 requirements of Section 1701.404(b), Occupations Code, as amended
1-43 by this Act, regardless of whether the county jailer completed the
1-44 required training and passed the examination before, on, or after
1-45 the effective date of this Act.

1-46 (b) The Commission on Law Enforcement Officer Standards and
1-47 Education may issue a certificate under Section 1701.404(c),
1-48 Occupations Code, as amended by this Act, to a justice of the peace
1-49 who is certified as a special officer for offenders with mental
1-50 impairments regardless of whether the justice of the peace was
1-51 certified before, on, or after the effective date of this Act.

1-52 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
