If the Act of the 81st Legislature, Regular 12 Session, 2009, relating to nonsubstantive additions to and 13 corrections in existing codes becomes law, Section 1 of this Act has 14 no effect.

15 (b) Section 2 of this Act takes effect only if the Act of the 16 81st Legislature, Regular Session, 2009, relating to 17 nonsubstantive additions to and corrections in existing codes becomes law. If the Act of the 81st Legislature, Regular Session, 18 2009, relating to nonsubstantive additions to and corrections in 19 existing codes does not become law, Section 2 of this Act has no 20 effect. 21
