## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

## AN ACT

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? relating to mandatory personal injury protection.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

4 SECTION 1. Section 1952.152, Insurance Code, is amended to 5 read as follows:

Sec. 1952.152. PERSONAL INJURY 6 PROTECTION COVERAGE 7 REQUIRED. [(a)] An insurer may not deliver or issue for delivery in this state an automobile liability insurance policy, including a 8 9 policy provided through the Texas Automobile Insurance Plan Association under Chapter 2151, that covers liability arising out 10 of the ownership, maintenance, or use of any motor vehicle unless 11 12 the insurer provides personal injury protection coverage in the policy or supplemental to the policy. 13

[(b) The coverage required by this subchapter does not apply 14 if any insured named in the insurance policy rejects the coverage in 15 16 writing. Unless the named insured requests in writing the coverage required by this subchapter, the insurer is not required to provide 17 that coverage in or supplemental to a reinstated insurance policy 18 or renewal insurance policy if the named insured rejected the 19 coverage in connection with that insurance policy or an insurance 20 policy previously issued to the insured by the same insurer or by an 21 22 affiliated insurer.

23 SECTION 2. Section 1952.153, Insurance Code, is amended to 24 read as follows:

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1 Sec. 1952.153. MAXIMUM REQUIRED AMOUNT OF PERSONAL INJURY 2 PROTECTION. This subchapter does not require an insurer to provide 3 personal injury protection coverage in an amount that exceeds 4 <u>\$10,000</u> [<del>\$2,500</del>] for all benefits, in the aggregate, for each 5 person.

6 SECTION 3. This Act applies only to an insurance policy or 7 contract or evidence of coverage that is delivered, issued for 8 delivery, or renewed on or after January 1, 2010. An insurance 9 policy or contract or evidence of coverage delivered, issued for 10 delivery, or renewed before January 1, 2010, is governed by the law 11 as it existed immediately before the effective date of this Act, and 12 that law is continued in effect for that purpose.

13 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.

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
