A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to tuition and fee exemptions at public institutions of
- 3 higher education for certain veterans of the Texas State Guard.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 54.203(a), Education Code, is amended to
- 6 read as follows:
- 7 (a) The governing board of each institution of higher
- 8 education shall exempt the following persons from the payment of
- 9 all dues, fees, and charges, including fees for correspondence
- 10 courses but excluding general deposit fees, student services fees,
- 11 and any fees or charges for lodging, board, or clothing, provided
- 12 the persons seeking the exemptions were citizens of Texas at the
- 13 time they entered the services indicated and have resided in Texas
- 14 for at least the period of 12 months before the date of
- 15 registration:
- 16 (1) all nurses and honorably discharged members of the
- 17 armed forces of the United States who served during the
- 18 Spanish-American War or during World War I;
- 19 (2) all nurses, members of the Women's Army Auxiliary
- 20 Corps, members of the Women's Auxiliary Volunteer Emergency
- 21 Service, and all honorably discharged members of the armed forces
- 22 of the United States who served during World War II except those who
- 23 were discharged from service because they were over the age of 38 or
- 24 because of a personal request on the part of the person that the

- 1 person [he] be discharged from service;
- 2 (3) all honorably discharged men and women of the
- 3 armed forces of the United States who served during the national
- 4 emergency which began on June 27, 1950, and which is referred to as
- 5 the Korean War; [and]
- 6 (4) all persons who were honorably discharged from the
- 7 armed forces of the United States after serving on active military
- 8 duty, excluding training, for more than 180 days and who served a
- 9 portion of their active duty during:
- 10 (A) the Cold War which began on the date of the
- 11 termination of the national emergency cited in Subdivision (3) [of
- 12 this subsection];
- 13 (B) the Vietnam era which began on December 21,
- 14 1961, and ended on May 7, 1975;
- 15 (C) the Grenada and Lebanon era which began on
- 16 August 24, 1982, and ended on July 31, 1984;
- 17 (D) the Panama era which began on December 20,
- 18 1989, and ended on January 21, 1990;
- 19 (E) the Persian Gulf War which began on August 2,
- 20 1990, and ends on the date thereafter prescribed by Presidential
- 21 proclamation or September 1, 1997, whichever occurs first;
- (F) the national emergency by reason of certain
- 23 terrorist attacks that began on September 11, 2001; or
- 24 (G) any future national emergency declared in
- 25 accordance with federal law; and
- 26 (5) all persons who were honorably discharged from the
- 27 Texas State Guard after serving on active duty, excluding training,

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- 1 for more than 180 days and who served a portion of that active duty
- 2 on or after September 1, 1971.
- 3 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies
- 4 beginning with tuition and fees charged for the 2009 fall semester.
- 5 Tuition and fees charged for an academic term or semester before the
- 6 2009 fall semester are covered by the law in effect immediately
- 7 before the effective date of this Act, and the former law is
- 8 continued in effect for that purpose.
- 9 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 10 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 11 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 12 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 13 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
