## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to a parent's right to obtain a copy of the public school

4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 26.004, Education Code, is amended to
6	read as follows:
7	Sec. 26.004. ACCESS TO STUDENT RECORDS. (a) A parent is
8	entitled to access to all written records of a school district
9	concerning the parent's child, including:
10	(1) attendance records;
11	(2) test scores;
12	(3) grades;
13	(4) disciplinary records;
14	(5) counseling records;
15	(6) psychological records;
16	(7) applications for admission;
17	(8) health and immunization information;
18	(9) teacher and counselor evaluations; and
19	(10) reports of behavioral patterns.
20	(b) A parent may make an oral or written request to obtain a
21	copy of a school district's records concerning the parent's child,
22	as described by Subsection (a). The district must comply with a
23	parent's request not later than the third school day after the date
24	the district receives the request. If a child is facing suspension.

- 1 removal, or expulsion from school, the district must comply with
- 2 the parent's request immediately. To the extent this subsection
- 3 conflicts with Chapter 552, Government Code, this subsection
- 4 prevails.
- 5 (c) Notwithstanding Section 26.012, a school district shall
- 6 provide a copy of student records requested under Subsection (b)
- 7 free of charge or at a cost not to exceed \$2 if the student is
- 8 educationally disadvantaged.
- 9 SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2009-2010
- 10 school year.
- 11 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 12 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 13 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 14 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 15 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
