2	relating to the certification of benefits coordinators at state
3	agencies by the Employees Retirement System of Texas and related
4	reports.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Chapter 815, Government Code, is amended by
7	adding Subchapter G to read as follows:
8	SUBCHAPTER G. CERTIFICATION TRAINING PROGRAM AND REPORTING
9	Sec. 815.551. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
10	(1) "Benefits coordinator" means an employee of a
11	state agency who has been designated by the agency as the person to:
12	(A) provide advice to employees of the agency on
13	benefits programs administered by the retirement system; and
14	(B) act as an agency liaison to the retirement
15	system.
16	(2) "Exception" means a request for assistance
17	processed by the retirement system that a benefits coordinator was
18	unable to handle in a timely manner.
19	Sec. 815.552. CERTIFICATION PROGRAM FOR AGENCY BENEFITS
20	COORDINATORS. (a) The retirement system shall develop a
21	certification program that provides training for benefits
22	coordinators.
23	(b) The retirement system shall require a person who is a
24	benefits coordinator to be certified under the certification

- 1 program not later than the first anniversary of the date the person
- 2 was designated as the benefits coordinator.
- 3 (c) The retirement system shall develop a refresher course
- 4 to update the training of a certified benefits coordinator and
- 5 offer the course at appropriate intervals as determined by the
- 6 retirement system.
- 7 (d) The retirement system may charge a state agency for
- 8 training the agency's benefits coordinator in an amount not to
- 9 exceed the actual cost of providing the training.
- Sec. 815.553. REPORT. Not later than June 1 of each year,
- 11 the retirement system shall provide to the board of trustees, the
- 12 governor, and the Legislative Budget Board a report covering the
- 13 preceding state fiscal year that includes:
- 14 (1) a list of state agencies that do not have a
- 15 benefits coordinator certified by the retirement system under the
- 16 program developed under Section 815.552;
- 17 (2) a list of state agencies that do not have dedicated
- 18 benefits staff;
- 19 (3) information related to providing support to the
- 20 agencies that do not have a certified benefits coordinator,
- 21 <u>including:</u>
- 22 (A) the costs incurred by the retirement system
- 23 <u>associated with handling calls from those agencies;</u>
- 24 (B) the number of exceptions the retirement
- 25 system processed for those agencies; and
- 26 (C) information about complaints received by the
- 27 retirement system from employees of those agencies; and

- 1 (4) suggested options for serving employees at small
- 2 agencies or agencies without dedicated benefits staff.
- 3 SECTION 2. (a) The Employees Retirement System of Texas
- 4 shall begin offering its certification program under Section
- 5 815.552, Government Code, as added by this Act, not later than June
- 6 1, 2010.
- 7 (b) The Employees Retirement System of Texas shall submit
- 8 the first report required by Section 815.553, Government Code, as
- 9 added by this Act, not later than June 1, 2010.
- 10 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 11 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 12 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 13 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 14 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
