## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to protective orders against family violence.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Section 71.0021(a), Family Code, is amended to
- 5 read as follows:
- 6 "Dating violence" means an act by an individual that is
- 7 against another individual with whom that person has or has had a
- dating relationship, or by an individual against another individual 8
- 9 who is in a dating relationship with a third individual with whom
- the actor is or has been in a dating relationship or marriage, and 10
- 11 that is intended to result in physical harm, bodily injury,
- 12 assault, or sexual assault or that is a threat that reasonably
- places the individual in fear of imminent physical harm, bodily 13
- injury, assault, or sexual assault, but does not include defensive 14
- measures to protect oneself. 15
- SECTION 2. Chapter 81, Family Code, is amended by adding 16
- Section 81.010 to read as follows: 17
- 18 Sec. 81.010. COURT ENFORCEMENT. (a) A court of this state
- with the jurisdiction of proceedings arising under this title may 19
- enforce a protective order rendered by another court in the same 20
- manner that the court that rendered the order could enforce the 21
- order, regardless of whether the order is transferred under 22
- 23 Subchapter D, Chapter 85.
- 24 (b) A court's authority under this section includes the

- 1 authority to enforce a protective order through contempt.
- 2 SECTION 3. Section 82.002(b), Family Code, is amended to
- 3 read as follows:
- 4 (b) With regard to family violence under Section 71.004(3),
- 5 an application for a protective order to protect the applicant may
- 6 be filed by  $\underline{a}$  [an adult] member of the dating relationship,
- 7 regardless of whether the member is an adult or a child.
- 8 SECTION 4. Sections 85.065(a) and (b), Family Code, are
- 9 repealed.
- 10 SECTION 5. The changes in law made by this Act to Sections
- 11 71.0021 and 82.002, Family Code, apply only to an application for a
- 12 protective order that is filed on or after the effective date of
- 13 this Act. An application for a protective order filed before the
- 14 effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on the
- 15 date the application is filed, and the former law is continued in
- 16 effect for that purpose.
- 17 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 18 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 19 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 20 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 21 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
