BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. This Act shall be known as Paisley's Law.

SECTION 2.

Section 42.042(e), Human Resources Code, amended to read as follows:

- The department shall promulgate minimum standards that (e) apply to licensed child-care facilities and to registered family homes covered by this chapter and that will:
- (1) promote the health, safety, and welfare of children attending a facility or registered family home;
  (2) promote safe, comfortable, and healthy physical
- facilities and registered family homes for children;
- (3) ensure adequate supervision of children bу capable, qualified, and healthy personnel;
- (4) ensure adequate and healthy food service where food service is offered;
- (5) prohibit racial discrimination by child-care facilities and registered family homes;
- (6) require procedures for parental and guardian consultation in the formulation of children's educational and therapeutic programs; [and]
- (7) prevent the breakdown of foster care and adoptive placement; and
- (8) ensure that a child-care facility or registered family home follows the written directives from a child's physician or other health care professional licensed under the Occupations Code when providing specialized medical assistance required by the child.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 1-39 1-40 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 1-41 1-42 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 1-43 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.

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
