A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT

- relating to creating a task force to develop uniform standards for 2
- subdivisions in the unincorporated areas of counties near the 3
- international border and in economically distressed counties. 4
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the current law 6
- regarding the regulation of subdivisions in the unincorporated 7
- areas of counties contains numerous conflicts and is unnecessarily 8
- complex, particularly regarding the regulation of development in 9
- counties near the international border and in economically 10
- distressed counties, and that uniform subdivision standards in 11
- 12 those counties serve an important purpose in promoting a high
- standard of living for the citizens of Texas. 13
- 14 SECTION 2. (a) The Task Force on Uniform County Subdivision
- Regulation is composed of 15 members appointed as follows: 15
- six members who are county officials responsible 16
- for regulating subdivisions under Subchapter B, Chapter 232, Local 17
- Government Code, appointed by the executive administrator of the 18
- Texas Water Development Board; 19
- 20 (2) three members who are county officials responsible
- 21 for regulating subdivisions under Subchapter C, Chapter 232, Local
- Government Code, appointed by the executive administrator of the 22
- 23 Texas Water Development Board;
- 24 (3) three members appointed by the governor to

- 1 represent private interests in land development;
- 2 (4) one member of the Texas Water Development Board
- 3 appointed by the governor;
- 4 (5) one member who has legal expertise in subdivision
- 5 regulation appointed by the attorney general to represent the
- 6 interests of the state; and
- 7 (6) one member who has legal expertise in matters
- 8 affecting land development appointed by the secretary of state to
- 9 represent the interests of the state.
- 10 (b) The members of the Task Force on Uniform County
- 11 Subdivision Regulation appointed under Subsection (a) of this
- 12 section shall elect a presiding officer, a secretary, and any other
- 13 officers the board considers necessary.
- 14 (c) Appointments to the Task Force on Uniform County
- 15 Subdivision Regulation shall be made without regard to race, color,
- 16 disability, sex, religion, age, or national origin of the
- 17 appointees.
- 18 (d) A member of the task force who is a state or county
- 19 employee is not entitled to additional compensation for serving on
- 20 the task force, but is entitled to reimbursement for the member's
- 21 actual and necessary expenses in attending meetings of the task
- 22 force and performing other official duties authorized by the
- 23 presiding officer if the reimbursement is otherwise available to
- 24 the member as a state or county employee.
- 25 (e) The secretary of state shall provide administrative
- 26 support to the task force, including necessary staff and meeting
- 27 facilities.

- 1 (f) The task force, through the secretary of state, may
- 2 accept gifts and grants from individuals, private or public
- 3 organizations, or federal or local funds to support the task force.
- 4 (g) Chapter 2110, Government Code, does not apply to the
- 5 task force.
- 6 SECTION 3. The Task Force on Uniform County Subdivision
- 7 Regulation shall:
- 8 (1) research and identify the conflicts and
- 9 deficiencies in current law regarding the regulation of the
- 10 development of subdivisions in the unincorporated areas of counties
- 11 near the international border and in economically distressed
- 12 counties; and
- 13 (2) develop recommendations and draft a proposal for
- 14 legislation to create uniform standards for the regulation of the
- 15 development of subdivisions in the unincorporated areas of counties
- 16 near the international border and in economically distressed
- 17 counties.
- SECTION 4. Not later than December 1, 2010, the Task Force
- 19 on Uniform County Subdivision Regulation shall submit its findings,
- 20 recommendations, and proposal for legislation to the standing
- 21 committees of the senate and house of representatives having
- 22 primary jurisdiction over border regions or county affairs.
- 23 SECTION 5. The Task Force on Uniform County Subdivision
- 24 Regulation is abolished and this Act expires on September 2, 2011.
- 25 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 26 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 27 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this

- 1 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 2 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
