Sec. 503.051. COUNSELING FOR GOVERNMENT OR EDUCATIONAL 1 INSTITUTION. (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b), this 2 3 [This] chapter does not apply to an activity, service, or use of an official title by a person employed as a counselor by a federal, 4 state, county, or municipal agency or public or private educational 5 institution if the person is performing counseling or 6 counseling-related activities within the scope of the person's 7 8 employment.

9 (b) This chapter applies to a person who is employed as a 10 counselor by a governmental agency if the counseling-related 11 activities within the scope of the person's employment include 12 providing services to one or more persons in the criminal or 13 juvenile justice system.

(c) This chapter: 3 4 (1) applies to a service performed by a person as a 5 volunteer or staff member if the person performs the service for one 6 or more persons in the criminal or juvenile justice system; and 7 (2) requires a public agency to employ a person licensed under this chapter if the agency provides services for 8 which a license is required under this section to one or more 9
