Section 42.0021, Parks and Wildlife Code, 4 is 5 amended to read as follows: Sec. 42.0021. LIFETIME [RESIDENT] HUNTING LICENSE. 6 The department may issue to <u>a resident</u> [residents] of this state or a 7 nonresident who was born in this state a lifetime [resident] 8 9 hunting license. SECTION 2. Section 42.0121, Parks and Wildlife Code, 10 is 11 amended to read as follows: 12 Sec. 42.0121. LIFETIME [RESIDENT] HUNTING LICENSE FEE. The fee for a lifetime [resident] hunting license is \$800 [\$300] or an 13 14 amount set by the commission, whichever amount is more. SECTION 3. Section 42.0175(a), Parks and Wildlife Code, is 15 amended to read as follows: 16 (a) A license issued under this chapter, other than a 17 lifetime [resident] hunting license or a nonresident five-day 18 special hunting license is valid only during the yearly period for 19 20 which the license is issued without regard to the date on which a 21 license is acquired. Each yearly period begins on September 1 or on another date set by the commission and extends through August 31 of 22 23 the next year or another date set by the commission. A license issued under this chapter other than a nonresident five-day special 24

1 hunting license that is issued before September 1 or another date set by the commission and does not expire until August 31 of the 2 3 next year or another date set by the commission is valid from the date of issuance through August 31 of the following year or another 4 5 date set by the commission. The commission by rule may set the amount of a license fee for a license issued during a transition 6 period at an amount lower than prescribed in this chapter and 7 8 provide for a license term for a transition period that is shorter or longer than a year. 9

SECTION 4. Section 46.004(d), Parks and Wildlife Code, is amended to read as follows:

(d) The department may issue a lifetime [resident] fishing
license to <u>a resident</u> [residents] of this state <u>or a nonresident who</u>
<u>was born in this state</u>. The fee for this license is <u>\$800</u> [\$300] or
an amount set by the commission, whichever amount is more.

SECTION 5. Section 46.007(e), Parks and Wildlife Code, is amended to read as follows:

(e) A lifetime [resident] fishing license is valid for the
lifetime of the license holder.

20 SECTION 6. Section 50.001(b), Parks and Wildlife Code, is 21 amended to read as follows:

(b) The department may issue to a resident of this state <u>or a</u> <u>nonresident who was born in this state</u> a lifetime combination hunting and fishing license.

25 SECTION 7. Section 50.002(b), Parks and Wildlife Code, is 26 amended to read as follows:

27 (b) The fee for the lifetime license is <u>\$1,500</u> [\$500] or an

1 amount set by the commission, whichever amount is more.

2 SECTION 8. Section 50.0021(c), Parks and Wildlife Code, is 3 amended to read as follows:

4 (c) A lifetime [resident] combination hunting and fishing
5 license is valid for the lifetime of the license holder.

6 SECTION 9. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
