## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT

- relating to an electronic diagnostic database for rural physicians. 2
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- SECTION 1. Chapter 1001, Health and Safety Code, is amended 4
- 5 by adding Subchapter E to read as follows:
- SUBCHAPTER E. ELECTRONIC DIAGNOSTIC DATABASE FOR RURAL PHYSICIANS 6
- Sec. 1001.101. CREATION OF DATABASE. (a) The department 7
- shall create an electronic database to assist physicians practicing 8
- 9 in rural areas in diagnosing rare or unusual illnesses or
- 10 conditions.
- 11 (b) The executive commissioner, by rule, shall designate
- for inclusion in the database diseases that are a threat to public 12
- 13 health.

- 14 (c) The database must be searchable based on a patient's
- symptoms, test results, or medical history. 15
- Sec. 1001.102. IMPLEMENTATION. The department shall place 16
- the system in rural clinics and hospitals across the state. 17
- Sec. 1001.103. FUNDING. In implementing the database, the 18
- department may use any available revenue, including federal 19
- disaster preparedness grant funds, other federal funds, and 20
- legislative appropriations, and may solicit and accept gifts, 21
- grants, and donations from a public or private source for the 22
- purposes of this subchapter. 23
- 24 SECTION 2. (a) The executive commissioner of the Health and

- 1 Human Services Commission shall adopt the rules required by Section
- 2 1001.101, Health and Safety Code, as added by this Act, not later
- 3 than December 1, 2009.
- 4 (b) The Department of State Health Services shall create and
- 5 implement the electronic diagnostic database for rural physicians
- 6 required by Subchapter E, Chapter 1001, Health and Safety Code, as
- 7 added by this Act, not later than September 1, 2010.
- 8 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 9 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 10 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 11 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 12 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
