- 5 SECTION 1. Section 123.005, Property Code, is amended to

- 7 Sec. 123.005. BREACH OF FIDUCIARY DUTY: VENUE. [(a)] Venue
- 8 in a proceeding brought by the attorney general alleging breach of a
- 9 fiduciary duty by a charitable entity or a fiduciary or managerial
- 10 agent of a charitable trust shall be a court of competent
- 11 jurisdiction in Travis County or in the county where the defendant
- 12 resides or has its principal office.
- 13 [(b) The attorney general, if successful in the proceeding,
- 14 is entitled to recover from a fiduciary or managerial agent of a
- 15 charitable trust actual costs incurred in bringing the suit and may
- 16 recover reasonable attorney's fees.
- 17 SECTION 2. Chapter 123, Property Code, is amended by adding
- 18 Section 123.006 to read as follows:
- 19 Sec. 123.006. ATTORNEY'S FEES. (a) In a proceeding subject
- 20 to Section 123.005, the attorney general, if successful in the
- 21 proceeding, is entitled to recover from the charitable entity or
- 22 <u>fiduciary or managerial agent of the charitable trust actual costs</u>
- 23 incurred in bringing the suit and may recover reasonable attorney's
- 24 fees.

- 1 (b) In a proceeding in which the attorney general intervenes
- 2 under this chapter, other than a proceeding subject to Section
- 3 123.005, a court may award the attorney general court costs and
- 4 reasonable and necessary attorney's fees as may seem equitable and
- 5 <u>just.</u>
- 6 SECTION 3. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 7 to a proceeding commenced on or after the effective date of this
- 8 Act. A proceeding commenced before the effective date of this Act
- 9 is governed by the law in effect immediately before that date, and
- 10 that law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 11 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
