A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
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- 2 relating to engineering recruitment programs at public or private
- 3 institutions of higher education and to certain degree programs at
- 4 public junior colleges.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 61.791(a), Education Code, is amended to 7 read as follows:
- 8 (a) The board shall establish and administer, using funds
- 9 appropriated for that purpose, a one-week summer program to take
- 10 place on the campus of each general academic teaching institution
- 11 or private or independent institution of higher education that
- 12 offers an engineering degree program. The summer program must be
- 13 designed for middle and high school students and to expose those
- 14 students to math, science, and engineering concepts that a student
- in an engineering degree program may encounter.
- SECTION 2. Sections 61.792(a) and (b), Education Code, are
- 17 amended to read as follows:
- 18 (a) The board shall establish and administer, using funds
- 19 appropriated for that purpose, scholarships for students pursuing a
- 20 degree in engineering at a general academic teaching institution or
- 21 a private or independent institution of higher education.
- (b) To qualify for a scholarship under this section, a
- 23 student must:
- (1) have graduated with a grade point average in the

- 1 top 20 percent of the student's high school graduating class;
- 2 (2) have graduated from high school with a grade point
- 3 average of at least 3.5 on a four-point scale or the equivalent in
- 4 mathematics and science courses offered under the recommended or
- 5 advanced high school program under Section 28.025(a); and
- 6 (3) maintain an overall grade point average of at
- 7 least 3.0 on a four-point scale at the general academic teaching
- 8 institution or the private or independent institution of higher
- 9 education in which the student is enrolled.
- SECTION 3. Sections 130.0012(a) and (b), Education Code,
- 11 are amended to read as follows:
- 12 (a) The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board shall
- 13 authorize a public junior college [colleges] to offer a
- 14 baccalaureate degree program that qualifies under Subsection (e)
- 15 if:
- 16 (1) the program is [programs] in the field [fields] of
- 17 applied science or [and] applied technology; or
- 18 (2) the public junior college previously participated
- 19 <u>in a pilot project to offer baccalaureate degree programs</u> [under
- 20 this section. Offering a baccalaureate degree program under this
- 21 section does not otherwise alter the role and mission of a public
- 22 junior college].
- 23 (b) Offering a baccalaureate degree program under this
- 24 section does not otherwise alter the role and mission of a public
- 25 junior college. [The coordinating board shall authorize
- 26 baccalaureate degree programs at each public junior college that
- 27 previously participated in a pilot project to offer baccalaureate

1 degree programs.

- 2 SECTION 4. (a) Sections 61.791 and 61.792, Education Code,
- 3 as amended by this Act, apply beginning with the 2009-2010 academic
- 4 year.
- 5 (b) The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board shall
- 6 adopt rules for the administration of Sections 61.791 and 61.792,
- 7 Education Code, as amended by this Act, as soon as practicable after
- 8 this Act takes effect. For that purpose, the coordinating board may
- 9 adopt the rules in the manner provided by law for emergency rules.
- SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 11 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 12 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 13 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 14 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
