A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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- 2 relating to engineering recruitment programs established by the
- 3 Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 61.791(a), Education Code, is amended to 6 read as follows:
- 7 (a) The board shall establish and administer, using funds
- 8 appropriated for that purpose, a one-week summer program to take
- 9 place on the campus of each general academic teaching institution
- 10 or private or independent institution of higher education that
- 11 offers an engineering degree program. The summer program must be
- 12 designed for middle and high school students and to expose those
- 13 students to math, science, and engineering concepts that a student
- 14 in an engineering degree program may encounter.
- SECTION 2. Sections 61.792(a) and (b), Education Code, are
- 16 amended to read as follows:
- 17 (a) The board shall establish and administer, using funds
- 18 appropriated for that purpose, scholarships for students pursuing a
- 19 degree in engineering at a general academic teaching institution or
- 20 <u>a private or independent institution of higher education</u>.
- 21 (b) To qualify for a scholarship under this section, a
- 22 student must:
- 23 (1) have graduated with a grade point average in the
- 24 top 20 percent of the student's high school graduating class;

- 1 (2) have graduated from high school with a grade point
- 2 average of at least 3.5 on a four-point scale or the equivalent in
- 3 mathematics and science courses offered under the recommended or
- 4 advanced high school program under Section 28.025(a); and
- 5 (3) maintain an overall grade point average of at
- 6 least 3.0 on a four-point scale at the general academic teaching
- 7 institution or the private or independent institution of higher
- 8 education in which the student is enrolled.
- 9 SECTION 3. (a) Sections 61.791 and 61.792, Education Code,
- 10 as amended by this Act, apply beginning with the 2009-2010 academic
- 11 year.
- 12 (b) The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board shall
- 13 adopt rules for the administration of Sections 61.791 and 61.792,
- 14 Education Code, as amended by this Act, as soon as practicable after
- 15 this Act takes effect. For that purpose, the coordinating board may
- 16 adopt the rules in the manner provided by law for emergency rules.
- 17 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 18 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 19 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 20 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 21 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
