4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 7, Education Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 7.0091 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 7.0091. BEST PRACTICES FOR DROPOUT PREVENTION AND
8	RECOVERY. In conjunction with the online clearinghouse of best
9	practices information established under Section 7.009, the agency
10	shall establish a dropout prevention assistance center to:
11	(1) identify successful or promising school district,
12	campus, or open-enrollment charter school dropout prevention and
13	recovery programs;
14	(2) collect and analyze performance data regarding
15	programs described by Subdivision (1);
16	(3) identify strategies or components common to
17	programs described by Subdivision (1);
18	(4) disseminate to school districts, open-enrollment
19	charter schools, and regional education service centers

online clearinghouse established under Section 7.009;

- 3 most appropriate for the district or charter school;
- 4 (6) identify programs described by Subdivision (1)
- 5 that educators or other employees of a school district,
- 6 open-enrollment charter school, and regional education service
- 7 center could visit and establish procedures for such learning

- 9 (7) develop or collect and provide information for
- 10 districts and open-enrollment charter schools interested in

- 15 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 16 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 17 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 18 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 19 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
