- 2 relating to open-source textbooks for public schools.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Section 31.002, Education Code, is amended by
- 5 amending Subdivision (1) and adding Subdivision (1-a) to read as
- 6 follows:
- 7 (1) "Electronic textbook" means computer software,
- 8 interactive videodisc, magnetic media, CD-ROM, computer
- 9 courseware, on-line services, an electronic medium, or other means
- 10 of conveying information to the student or otherwise contributing
- 11 to the learning process through electronic means, including an
- 12 <u>open-source textbook</u>.
- 13 (1-a) "Open-source textbook" means an electronic
- 14 textbook that is available for downloading from the Internet at no
- 15 charge to a student and without requiring the purchase of an unlock
- 16 code, membership, or other access or use charge, except for a charge
- 17 to order an optional printed copy of all or part of the textbook.
- 18 SECTION 2. Subchapter B, Chapter 31, Education Code, is
- 19 amended by adding Section 31.0241 to read as follows:
- Sec. 31.0241. ADOPTION OF OPEN-SOURCE TEXTBOOKS. (a) In
- 21 this section, "eligible institution" means:
- 22 <u>(1) a public, private, or independent college or</u>
- 23 university located in this state that spends at least \$75 million
- 24 per year on research that may be reported under Section 61.051(h);

- 1 <u>or</u>
- 2 (2) a public technical institute, as defined by
- 3 Section 61.003.
- 4 (b) The State Board of Education shall place an open-source
- 5 textbook for a secondary-level course submitted for adoption by an
- 6 eligible institution on a conforming or nonconforming list if:
- 7 (1) the textbook is written, compiled, or edited
- 8 primarily by faculty of the eligible institution who specialize in
- 9 the subject area of the textbook;
- 10 (2) the eligible institution identifies each
- 11 contributing author;
- 12 (3) the appropriate department of the eligible
- 13 institution certifies the textbook for accuracy; and
- 14 (4) the eligible institution determines that the
- 15 textbook qualifies for placement on the conforming or nonconforming
- 16 list and certifies that:
- 17 (A) for a textbook for a senior-level course, a
- 18 student who successfully completes a course based on the textbook
- 19 will be prepared, without remediation, for entry into the eligible
- 20 institution's freshman-level course in that subject; or
- 21 (B) for a textbook for a junior-level and
- 22 <u>senior-level</u> course, a student who successfully completes the
- 23 junior-level course based on the textbook will be prepared for
- 24 entry into the senior-level course.
- 25 (c) This section does not prohibit an eligible institution
- 26 from submitting a textbook for placement on a conforming or
- 27 nonconforming list through any other adoption process provided by

- 1 this chapter.
- 2 SECTION 3. Section 31.026, Education Code, is amended by
- 3 adding Subsection (e) to read as follows:
- 4 (e) This section does not apply to an open-source textbook.
- 5 SECTION 4. Subchapter B, Chapter 31, Education Code, is
- 6 amended by adding Section 31.0261 to read as follows:
- 7 <u>Sec. 31.0261. CONTRACTS FOR PRINTING OF OPEN-SOURCE</u>
- 8 TEXTBOOKS. The State Board of Education may execute a contract for
- 9 the printing of an open-source textbook listed on the conforming or
- 10 <u>nonconforming list. The contract must allow a school district to</u>
- 11 requisition printed copies of an open-source textbook as provided
- 12 by Section 31.103.
- SECTION 5. Section 31.027, Education Code, is amended by
- 14 adding Subsection (d) to read as follows:
- 15 (d) This section does not apply to an open-source textbook.
- SECTION 6. Section 31.103, Education Code, is amended by
- 17 adding Subsection (d) to read as follows:
- 18 (d) A school district or open-enrollment charter school
- 19 that selects an open-source textbook shall requisition a sufficient
- 20 number of printed copies for use by students unable to access the
- 21 <u>textbook electronically unless the district or school provides to</u>
- 22 each student:
- 23 (1) electronic access to the textbook at no cost to the
- 24 student; or
- 25 (2) printed copies of the portion of the textbook that
- 26 will be used in the course.
- SECTION 7. Section 31.104, Education Code, is amended by

- 1 amending Subsections (b) and (c) and adding Subsections (g) and (h)
- 2 to read as follows:
- 3 (b) A school district or open-enrollment charter school may
- 4 order replacements for textbooks that have been lost or damaged
- 5 directly from:
- 6 (1) the textbook depository; [or]
- 7 (2) the textbook publisher or manufacturer if the
- 8 textbook publisher or manufacturer does not have a designated
- 9 textbook depository in this state under Section 31.151(a)(6)(B); or
- 10 (3) any source for a printed copy of an open-source
- 11 textbook.
- 12 (c) Each textbook must state that the textbook is the
- 13 property of or is licensed to this state, as appropriate. Each
- 14 textbook, other than an electronic textbook or a printed copy of an
- 15 open-source textbook, must be covered by the student under the
- 16 direction of the teacher. Except as provided by Subsection (g), a
- 17 [A] student must return all textbooks to the teacher at the end of
- 18 the school year or when the student withdraws from school.
- 19 (g) At the end of the school year for which an open-source
- 20 textbook that a school district or open-enrollment charter school
- 21 does not intend to use for another student is distributed, the
- 22 printed copy of the open-source textbook becomes the property of
- 23 the student to whom it is distributed.
- 24 (h) This section does not apply to an electronic copy of an
- 25 open-source textbook.
- SECTION 8. Section 31.151(a), Education Code, is amended to
- 27 read as follows:

- 1 (a) A publisher or manufacturer of textbooks:
- 2 (1) shall furnish any textbook the publisher or
- 3 manufacturer offers in this state, at a price that does not exceed
- 4 the lowest price at which the publisher offers that textbook for
- 5 adoption or sale to any state, public school, or school district in
- 6 the United States;
- 7 (2) shall automatically reduce the price of a textbook
- 8 sold for use in a school district or open-enrollment charter school
- 9 to the extent that the price is reduced elsewhere in the United
- 10 States;
- 11 (3) shall provide any textbook or ancillary item free
- 12 of charge in this state to the same extent that the publisher or
- 13 manufacturer provides the textbook or ancillary item free of charge
- 14 to any state, public school, or school district in the United
- 15 States;
- 16 (4) shall guarantee that each copy of a textbook sold
- 17 in this state is at least equal in quality to copies of that
- 18 textbook sold elsewhere in the United States and is free from
- 19 factual error;
- 20 (5) may not become associated or connected with,
- 21 directly or indirectly, any combination in restraint of trade in
- 22 textbooks or enter into any understanding or combination to control
- 23 prices or restrict competition in the sale of textbooks for use in
- 24 this state;
- 25 (6) shall:
- 26 (A) maintain a depository in this state or
- 27 arrange with a depository in this state to receive and fill orders

- 1 for textbooks, other than open-source textbooks, on-line
- 2 textbooks, or on-line textbook components, consistent with State
- 3 Board of Education rules; or
- 4 (B) deliver textbooks to a school district or
- 5 open-enrollment charter school without a delivery charge to the
- 6 school district, open-enrollment charter school, or state, if:
- 7 (i) the publisher or manufacturer does not
- 8 maintain or arrange with a depository in this state under Paragraph
- 9 (A) and the publisher's or manufacturer's textbooks and related
- 10 products are warehoused or otherwise stored less than 300 miles
- 11 from a border of this state; or
- 12 (ii) the textbooks are <u>open-source</u>
- 13 textbooks, on-line textbooks, or on-line textbook components;
- 14 (7) shall, at the time an order for textbooks is
- 15 acknowledged, provide to school districts or open-enrollment
- 16 charter schools an accurate shipping date for textbooks that are
- 17 back-ordered;
- 18 (8) shall guarantee delivery of textbooks at least 10
- 19 business days before the opening day of school of the year for which
- 20 the textbooks are ordered if the textbooks are ordered by a date
- 21 specified in the sales contract; and
- 22 (9) shall submit to the State Board of Education an
- 23 affidavit certifying any textbook the publisher or manufacturer
- 24 offers in this state to be free of factual errors at the time the
- 25 publisher executes the contract required by Section 31.026.
- SECTION 9. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
