A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 relating to the circumstances under which the Department of Public
- 3 Safety may issue a silver alert for a missing senior citizen.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 411.383(b), Government Code, is amended
- 6 to read as follows:
- 7 (b) The director shall adopt rules and issue directives as
- 8 necessary to ensure proper implementation of the alert. The rules
- 9 and directives must include:
- 10 $\hspace{1cm}$ (1) the procedures to be used by a local law
- 11 enforcement agency to verify whether a senior citizen:
- 12 (A) is missing; and
- 13 (B) has an impaired mental condition;
- 14 (2) a description of the circumstances under which a
- 15 local law enforcement agency is required or authorized to report a
- 16 missing senior citizen to the department; and
- 17 (3) the procedures to be used by an individual or
- 18 entity to report information about a missing senior citizen to
- 19 designated media outlets in Texas.
- SECTION 2. Subchapter M, Chapter 411, Government Code, is
- 21 amended by adding Section 411.3865 to read as follows:
- Sec. 411.3865. MISSING SENIOR CITIZEN IN IMMINENT DANGER.
- 23 The director shall adopt rules authorizing a local law enforcement
- 24 agency to request the issuance of an alert under this subchapter for

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- 1 a missing senior citizen whose life may be in imminent danger,
- 2 regardless of whether the agency is able to verify the information
- 3 otherwise required by Section 411.386(a)(2).
- 4 SECTION 3. Section 411.387(a), Government Code, is amended
- 5 to read as follows:
- 6 (a) When a local law enforcement agency provides notice of a
- 7 <u>missing senior citizen to [notifies</u>] the department under Section
- 8 411.386 or 411.3865, the department shall confirm the accuracy of
- 9 the information provided with the notice and, if confirmed,
- 10 immediately issue an alert under this subchapter in accordance with
- 11 department rules.
- 12 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 13 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 14 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 15 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 16 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
