1 to a claim for workers' compensation benefits based on a 2 compensable injury that occurs on or after the effective date of 3 this Act. A claim based on a compensable injury that occurs before 4 the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on 5 the date the compensable injury occurred, and the former law is 6 continued in effect for that purpose.

SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
