5	SECTION 1. Sections 755.011(b) and (c), Health and Safety
6	Code, are amended to read as follows:
7	(b) The board is composed of the following <u>11</u> [nine] members
8	appointed by the presiding officer of the commission, with the
9	commission's approval:
10	(1) three members representing persons who own or use
11	boilers in this state;
12	(2) three members representing companies that insure
13	boilers in this state;
14	(3) one member representing boiler manufacturers or
15	installers;
16	(4) one member representing organizations that repair
17	or alter boilers in this state; [and]
18	(5) one member representing a labor union; and
19	(6) two public members.
20	(c) All members except the members appointed under
21	Subsection (b)(6) [A member] must have experience with boilers. To
22	the extent possible, at least four members should be professional
23	engineers registered in this state.
24	SECTION 2. Section 1152.102, Occupations Code, is amended

H.B. No. 2548 by amending Subsections (a) and (c) and adding Subsection (d) to 1 read as follows: 2 3 (a) The council is composed of seven [six] members appointed by the presiding officer of the commission, with the commission's 4 5 approval. (c) Except as provided by Subsection (d), each [Each] person 6 7 appointed for membership on the council must: 8 (1) be a registered senior property tax consultant; 9 (2) be a member of a nonprofit and voluntary trade 10 association: (A) membership consists primarily 11 whose of 12 persons who perform property tax consulting services in this state or who engage in property tax management in this state for other 13 14 persons; 15 (B) that has written experience and examination requirements for membership; and 16 17 (C) that subscribes to a code of professional conduct or ethics; 18 (3) be a resident of this state for the five years 19 preceding the date of the appointment; and 20 21 (4) have performed or supervised the performance of property tax consulting services as the person's primary occupation 22 continuously for the five years preceding the date of the 23 24 appointment. (d) One member of the council must be a public member. 25 SECTION 3. Section 1302.201, Occupations Code, is amended 26 27 to read as follows:

Sec. 1302.201. ADVISORY BOARD 1 MEMBERSHIP. The air conditioning and refrigeration contractors advisory board consists 2 of <u>seven</u> [six] members appointed by the presiding officer of the 3 commission, with the commission's approval, and two ex officio 4 5 nonvoting members. One member of the advisory board must be a public member. 6

7 SECTION 4. Section 1602.051(a), Occupations Code, is 8 amended to read as follows:

9 (a) The Advisory Board on Cosmetology consists of <u>seven</u> 10 [five] members appointed by the presiding officer of the 11 commission, with the commission's approval, as follows:

12 (1) one member who holds a license for a beauty shop13 that is part of a chain of beauty shops;

14 (2) one member who holds a license for a beauty shop15 that is not part of a chain of beauty shops;

16 (3) one member who holds a private beauty culture 17 school license; [and]

18 (4) two members who each hold an operator license<u>;</u>

19(5) one member who represents a licensed public20secondary or postsecondary beauty culture school; and

21

(6) one public member.

22 SECTION 5. Section 1802.102(a), Occupations Code, is 23 amended to read as follows:

(a) The advisory board consists of <u>seven</u> [five] members
 appointed as follows:

(1) three members who are licensed auctioneersappointed by the presiding officer of the commission, with the

1 commission's approval;

2 (2) the executive director of the Texas [Department
3 of] Economic Development <u>and Tourism Office</u> or the director's
4 designee; [and]

5 (3) the commissioner of education or the 6 commissioner's designee; and

(4) two public members.

8 SECTION 6. Section 1802.105, Occupations Code, is amended 9 to read as follows:

Sec. 1802.105. REMOVAL. A member appointed under Section 11 1802.102(a)(1) may be removed by a <u>six-sevenths</u> [four-fifths] vote of the advisory board.

13 SECTION 7. Section 2308.051(a), Occupations Code, is 14 amended to read as follows:

15 (a) The advisory board consists of the following members 16 appointed by the presiding officer of the commission with the 17 approval of the commission:

18 (1) one representative of a towing company operating19 in a county with a population of less than one million;

20 (2) one representative of a towing company operating
21 in a county with a population of one million or more;

(3) one owner of a vehicle storage facility located in
a county with a population of less than one million;

24 (4) one owner of a vehicle storage facility located in25 a county with a population of one million or more;

26 (5) one parking facility owner;

27 (6) one law enforcement officer from a county with a

1 population of less than one million;

2 (7) one law enforcement officer from a county with a
3 population of one million or more; [and]

4 (8) one representative of property and casualty
5 insurers who write automobile insurance in this state; and

6

(9) one public member.

7 SECTION 8. The presiding officer of the Texas Commission of 8 Licensing and Regulation shall appoint the public members of the 9 advisory bodies to the Texas Department of Licensing and 10 Regulation, as required by this Act, not later than December 1, 11 2009.

12 SECTION 9. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
