7 (b) Except as provided by Subsection (c) or (d), for [For] 8 purposes of Subsection (a)(1), obtaining or furnishing information 9 includes information obtained or furnished through the review and 10 analysis of, and the investigation into the content of, 11 computer-based data not available to the public.

12 (c) "Obtaining or furnishing information" does not include 13 obtaining or furnishing computer-based data by a person acting as a 14 computer data recovery specialist or computer forensic analyst, as 15 those terms are defined by Section 107.001, Business & Commerce 16 Code, which does not constitute an investigation for purposes of 17 this section and does not require licensing under this chapter.

18 (d) The repair or maintenance of a computer does not 19 constitute an investigation for purposes of this section and does 20 not require licensing under this chapter if the person performing 21 the repair or maintenance:

22 (1) is installing or repairing computer equipment or 23 diagnosing a computer or software problem; and

24 (2) is not furnishing information or securing evidence
25 described by Subsection (a)(1) or (2).

26 (e) A computer data recovery specialist or computer 27 forensic analyst, as those terms are defined by Section 107.001,
